Description of Squadron Emblem

The Cadet Second Squadron emblem (patch) is a circular field of sky blue bordered in black. Centered on the blue field is a silver and grey eagle with wings spread. The eagle is supporting beneath its breast the white star and red circle insignia formerly used in USAF aircraft marking. Rays of gold light emanate from the insignia and radiate to either side across the wings of the eagle. Behind the eagle is a royal blue numeral two. There is no known symbolism associated with the emblem.
