

Ltr, Hq USAFA (CWOC), 26 Sep 62, Req for Approval of Ogn Emblem

1. In accordance with AFR 900-3, 5 November 1959, the following emblem is approved for the 22d Cadet Squadron, Air Force Cadet Wings:

DESCRIPTION: On a triangle, one point up, the base arched, per fess red and white, edged medium blue, bordered white, edged silver gray; in chief an Arabic numeral 22, in perspective, medium blue and white; issuing from the border eight (8) light beams, two from dexter (right), two from sinister (left) Air Force golden yellow and medium blue, two from dexter base, two from sinister base, silver gray and red, all converging to fess point and surmounted by a silver gray saber, palewise in perspective, pointing to the numeral 22, the hilt garnished with the Navigator's Badge and the pommel garnished with a globe, water areas dark gray.

SIGNIFICANCE: The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. Against a background of red for courage, the numeral 22 indicates the squadron's designation. The light rays in the colors of the four cadet classes converge to indicate unity of purpose among all ranks. Surmounting these rays a saber, bearing the Navigator's Badge and a globe, represents strength and readiness.
