Request for Approval of Organization Emblems

1. Request for approval of the attached Organizational Emblem is submitted in accordance with Air Force Regulation 900-3 dated 1 November 1966.
2. Description:
  - a. Designs attached depict the emblem for which approval is desired.
  - b. The aerospace vehicle displayed is not intended to portray any specific type aircraft, it is intended to represent an aircraft, the United States Air Forces' primary device for conducting peacetime and wartime operations.
  - c. The number "twenty-eight" sets the emblem apart as being that of the Twenty-Eighth Squadron of the Cadet Wing.
3. Significance of Colors:
  - a. Ultramarine Blue AF depicts the sky, primary theater of Air Force operations.
  - b. Black bordering lines, black aircraft, and black bow-wave bear no significance; the color was selected for clarity of design.
  - c. Air Force Golden Yellow is representative of the first fourth class of cadets to enter the 28th Squadron. The class of 71's color is AF Golden Yellow signifying the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel.
4. While Air Force Regulation 900-3 clearly states in paragraph 4a(8) that no numerals will appear in the design area, exception is requested in this instance. There is no tactical significance to the numbering of the cadet squadrons, also these squadrons are unique in that there will be no redesignation of numbered squadrons regardless of future Academy expansion.
5. Approval of this request will result in increased motivation and morale, and enhance the prestige of the Air Force Cadet Wing.
