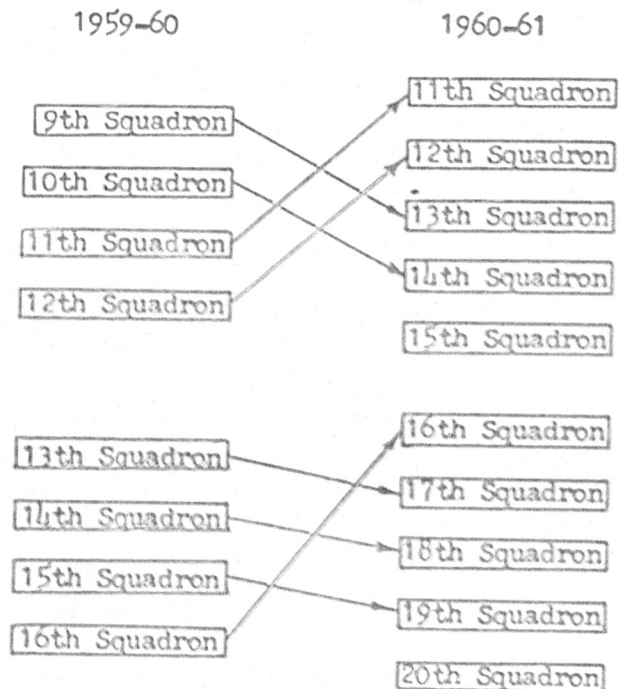
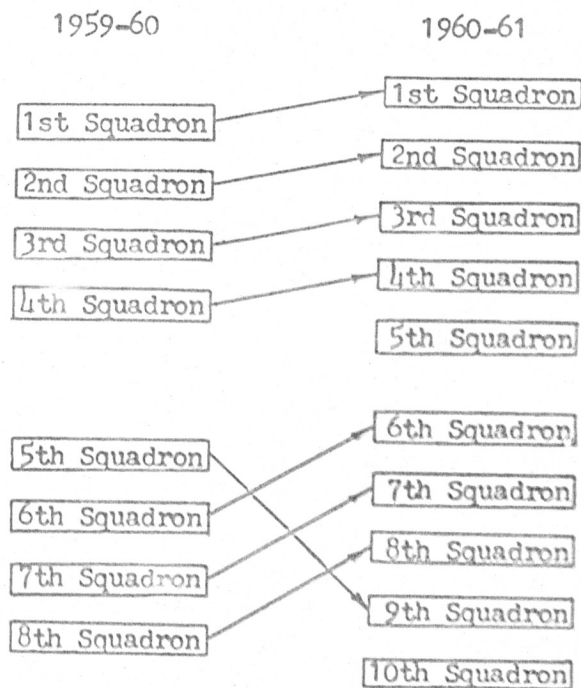

REDESIGNATION

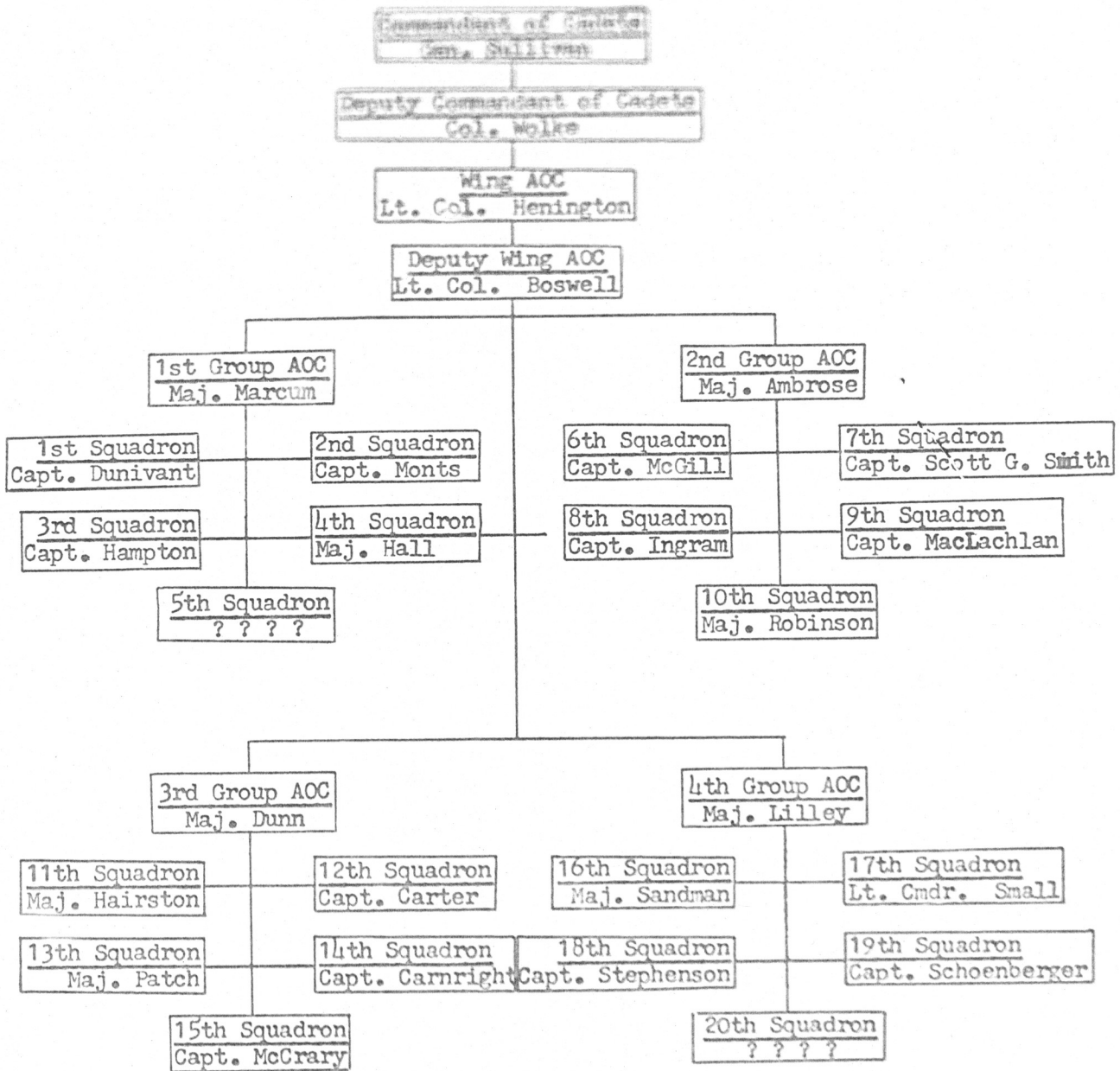
With the new organization in squadrons will come a new organization in the Comm Shop. Among other things, they're doing away with the double deputy system. Colonel Wolke will be the new Deputy Commandant, since Colonel Seith is going to the Air War College in Washington. The functions heretofore performed by the Deputy Comm will be handled next year by the Wing AOC and his deputy. There will be 20 squadrons, but still only 4 groups. In general, everyone will remain with his own group, although there will undoubtedly be a few exceptions to this. 1st Group will be unchanged, except that members of each squadron will be drawn to form 5th Squadron. In 2nd Group, 5th Squadron will be redesignated 9th Squadron, 6th thru 8th Squadrons will stay the same, and 10th Squadron will be formed from all four. In 3rd Group

only 11th and 12th Squadrons stay the same, 7th being redesignated 13th, and 10th being redesignated 14th. As in the other groups, 15th will be formed from cadets from all four squadrons. In 4th Group, only 16th Squadron remains unchanged. 13th, 14th, and 15th become 17th, 18th, and 19th respectively. All four contribute to 20th.

There will be 8 new AOC's. At this time, 5th Squadron does not have one and 20th Squadron does not have one. The other 6 new AOC's will go to 7th, 9th, 10th, 12th, 15th, and 19th Squadrons. In general, the present AOC's, who are not being re-assigned, will remain with their present squadrons as redesignated (for example, Capt. Carnright, 10th Squadron AOC, will become the AOC of 14th Squadron, since 10th Squadron is being redesignated 14th Squadron.

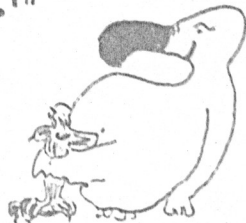

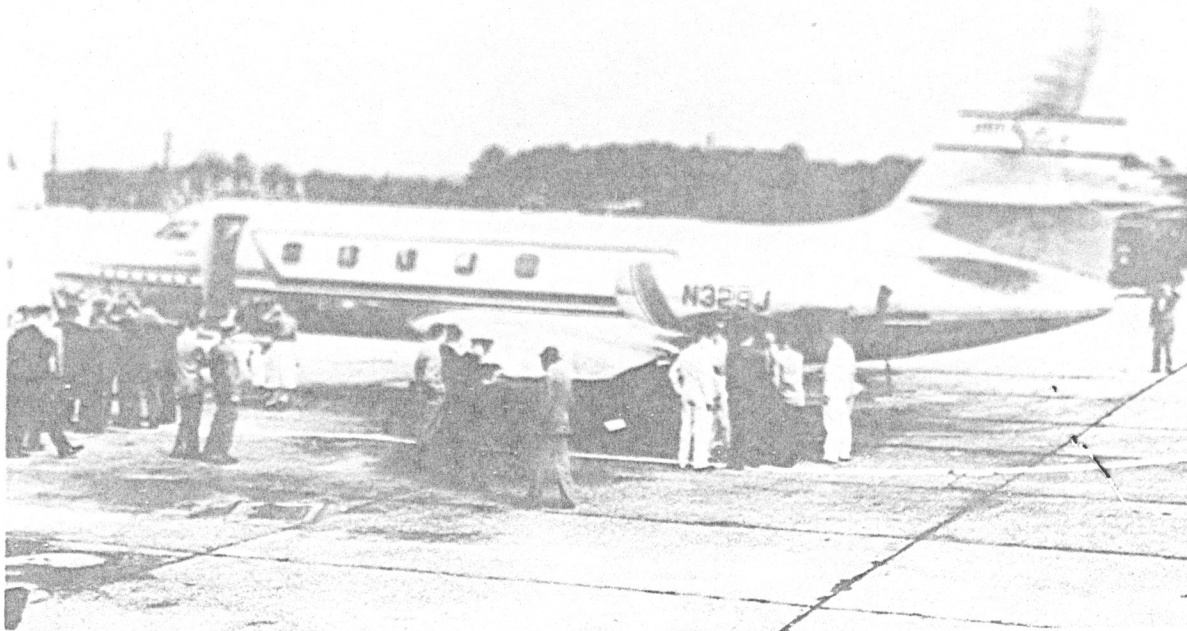
