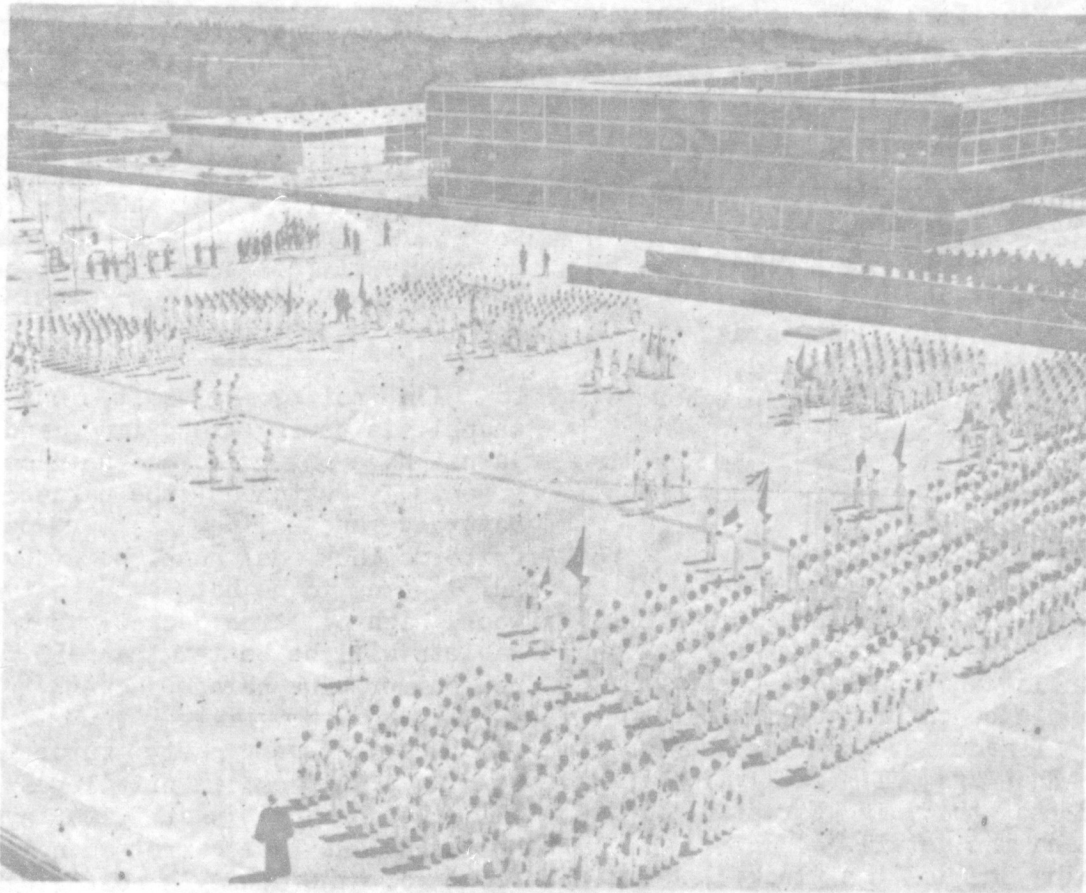

The BASEBALL TEAM has 7 straight wins now. Last week we took a double-header from Regis 2-0 and 12-8. Jim Kyle pitched a beautiful 1-hitter and John Kuenzel supplied the runs with his 2-run homer. In the second game Kaley and Norris combined efforts for the win and were backed by good hitting.

A strong Wyoming team fell before the fancy Falcons in a 15-hit team effort with Kyle once again picking up the win.

This past Monday, Bob Schaumberg pitched the Falcons to a 12-4 win over Colorado College on a 19-hit game by the cadets, Pederson getting 4 for 5 and Quinlan having a big homer. Defensively, we played fine errorless ball.

Next we meet CSC in the NCAA Regional Playoffs, here Wednesday and in Greeley on Thursday. If we take this one, we meet the winner of the Wyoming vs. Utah game; and the winner of this one goes to the Nationals in Omaha.

The TRACKSTERS started out in fine style by taking 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in the mile at Tucson, Arizona. Carlstrom with 4:16, Wedemeyer with 4:18, and Billelo with 4:19 put in the best mile show of the year in that event. Hallager and Brucher finished 1st and 2nd in the 440 with a 49.2. Fleming, Perlotto, and Foster also took top 3 in the half-mile, and John Fer pulled 2nd in the two-mile.

Besides these fine distance runs, though, we were very much lacking, and Arizona won the meet 92-47 in our final meet of the season.

The LACROSSE TEAM defeated C.U. 7-3 to gain possession of the Rocky Mountain Collegiate Championship Trophy on a fine come from behind wind and some sharp shooting by Travis and Meyers. McCall and Reavely turned in their usual excellent games, on defense, in this hard-hitting contest.

Then, this past week-end, The Denver LaCrosse Club outclassed the cadets with their 6 All-Americans and gained a 10-6 win at the Denver University Stadium.
