Saturday night the 1962-63 Falcon basketball team launches itself into the most testing cage schedule ever faced by an Air Force Academy quintet ... and in that opening contest, Coach Bob Spear and his Falcons — Rog Zoeller, Jim Diffendorfer, Johnny Judd, Nick Lacey, Par Hinman, Roger Head, John Sowers, Mike Pavich, Rich Porter, and a group of soph hopefuls— may be meeting their biggest single test of the season in Wisconsin's Big Ten favorites. The Badgers lost only one man from the squad that last year was the only fivesome to conquer powerful Ohio State in regular season play. A victory in this opener could spell a successful season for USAFA ... to gain that victory, last year's 2000+ team will have to be on that court. To establish ourselves, 1963 and 2500-strong on opening night, is to begin to pave that highway back to the NCAA.

In the only previous meeting of the two clubs, the Badgers captured an 80-67 victory. That was in 1961, and it was in Badger-land. This is 1962, and this is Falcon-land. ITS OPEN SEASON....

Halfway through the first quarter, tackle George Hanseth blocked his first of two punts to give the Frosh the ball on the JV 12. Several plays later, halfback Milt Spiegelhauer drove across from the one for the score. The conversion by Capicik was good. In the second quarter, Hanseth blocked his second punt which he picked up on the 15 and ran for the TD, leaving the score 13-0 at the half. The third Frosh score was a 22-yard pass-lateral play from Graham to Geth to Greenlee which came after Graham's partially blocked kick was recovered on their own 40. Capicik again kicked for one point. The last score of the game came in the closing minutes of the 4th quarter when quarterback Jim Graham went across from the 2 after a 58-yard drive. Radtke kicked the extra point making the final score 27-0.

The Falcon Soccer team traveled to San Francisco only to lose to California 4-3 and a strong University of San Francisco team 2-1. 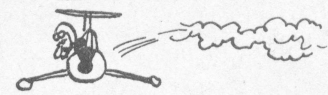

"Trouble?" said she. "There'll be no trouble. My girls have it up here," she replied while tapping her forehead significantly.

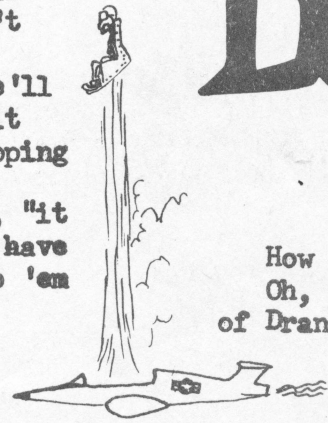

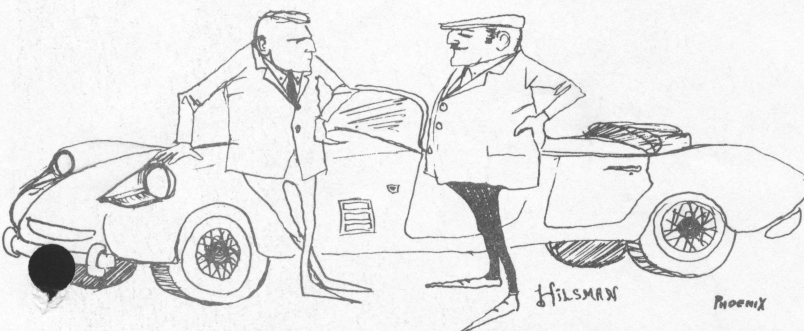
