PART II (Recommended time -- 36 sec; Weight -- 2019 points)

Mechanics

There is a doolie double-timing along the terazzo at $178\frac{1}{2}$ steps per minute; he is 58" tall and his legs are 21" long. The angular velocity of his left leg is 436 radians per second; his right leg has an " ω " of 2100 rad/sec. His step is an average of 81". His element leader is 8' $7\frac{1}{2}$ " high and is driving a Harley-Davidson motorcycle at mach .46 up the ramp. There is no muffler on the exhaust pipe, and the exit velocity of the gas is 2500 ft/sec. (reversible, adiabatic, steady flow). The tires are 5-ply nylon and have a coefficient of friction with the ramp of $0.69 \epsilon \int \frac{2\pi h^2}{v^2} dv$. An AOC ($\rho_{\text{head}} = \text{lbs/in}^3$), chasing a cadet who has stolen his trousers, is pedalling his tricycle at exactly 81 millicubits per second. He is licking a red popsicle and is wearing Mickey Mouse Club Ears. Find:

- b. Tensile strength of the AOC
- c. The pollen count

2. Physics

- a. Draw and label the free body diagrams for the following system and conditions:

A human female (36-24-36) is trying to get through a door jam that is 12" wide. The height of the door is 6' and the female is 5'2". Her hair is blonde and she has blue eyes in light $\lambda = 3500 \text{ \AA}$ and green eyes in light $\lambda = 6250 \text{ \AA}$. (You are desperately trying to take a picture with a 35mm Schmidt Astronomical camera f/6, angular field 6° .) Wearing a sweater which is 3 sizes too small and 10.4 cm spike heels, she first tries to go through the door frontwards and then backwards.

- b. Compute your rise in temperature in degrees Kelvin assuming no heat loss to increasing surface area.

You have now completed your examination. Wasn't it fun? If you wish, you may go back and check your answers. (This would actually prove a fruitless effort, because the PE Department has not yet returned the basketball stats from which we draw our approved solution.) Well, our best for the holidays.

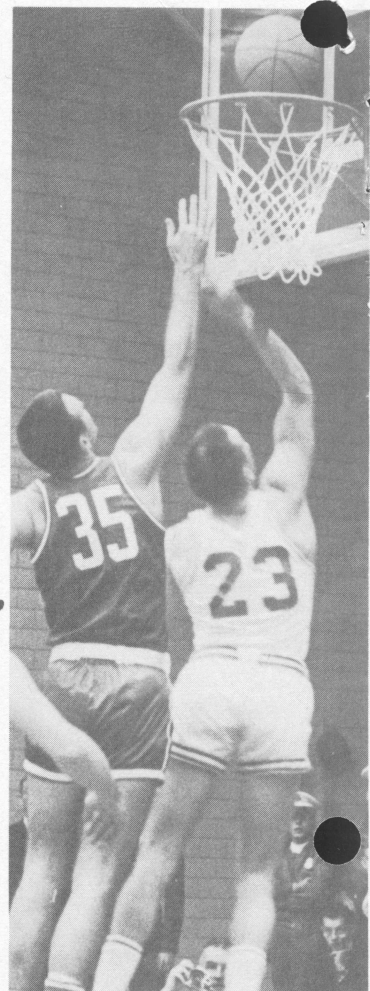

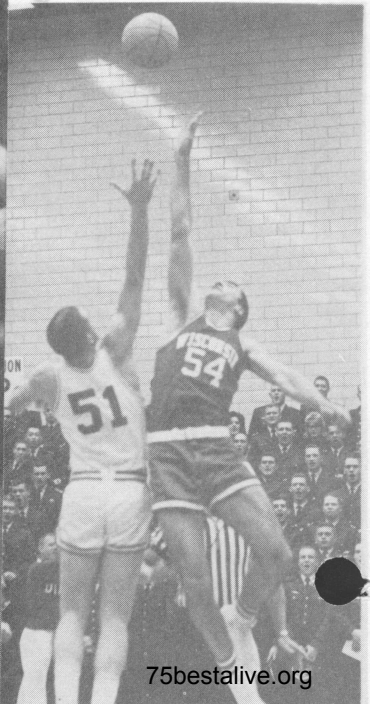
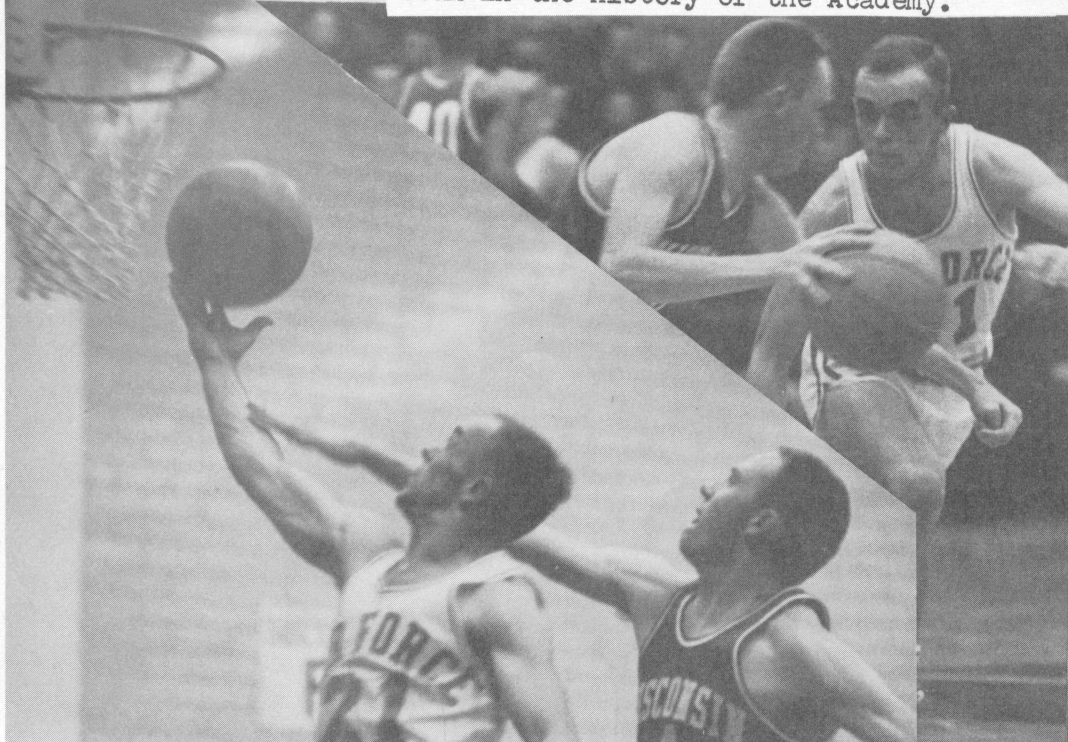
