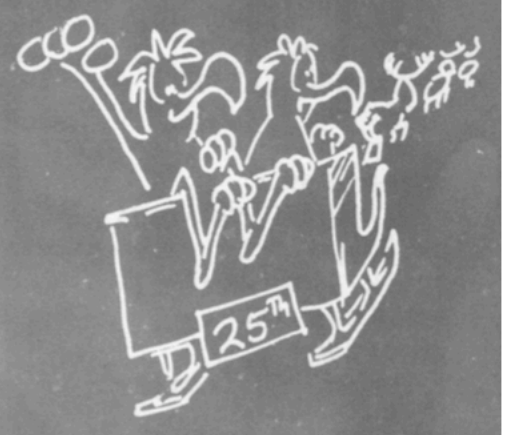


To All Cadet Dodo Fans:

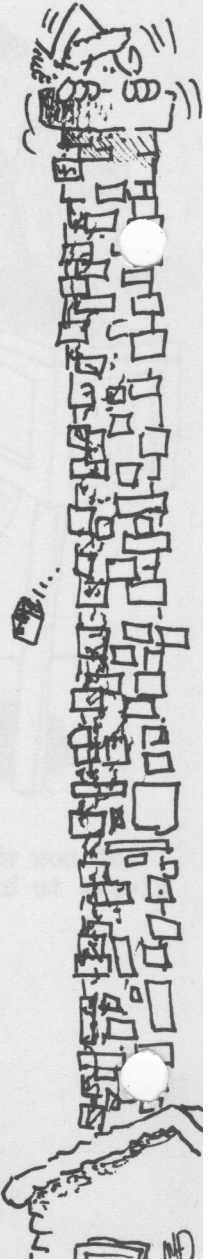

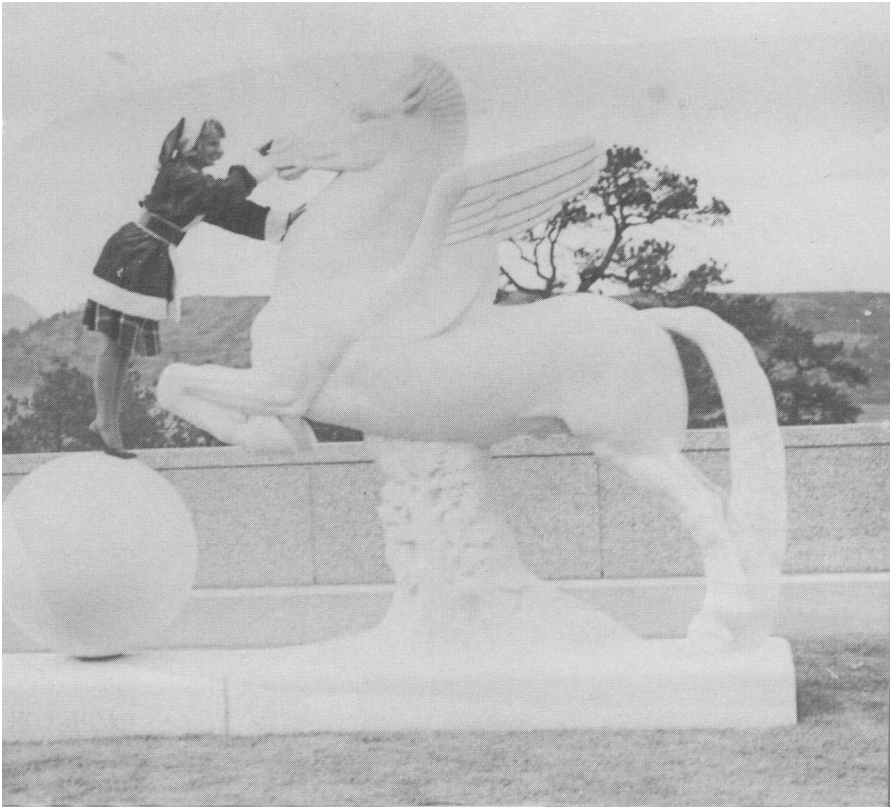

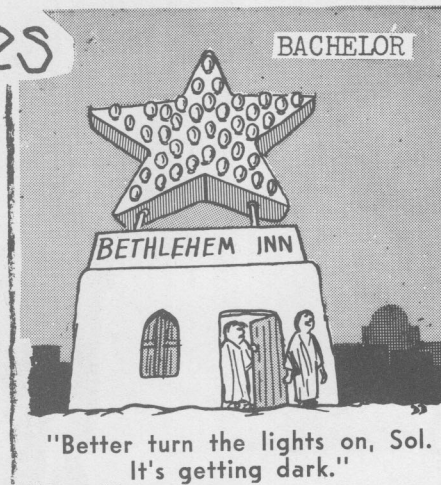

 Were blown to hell tonight.



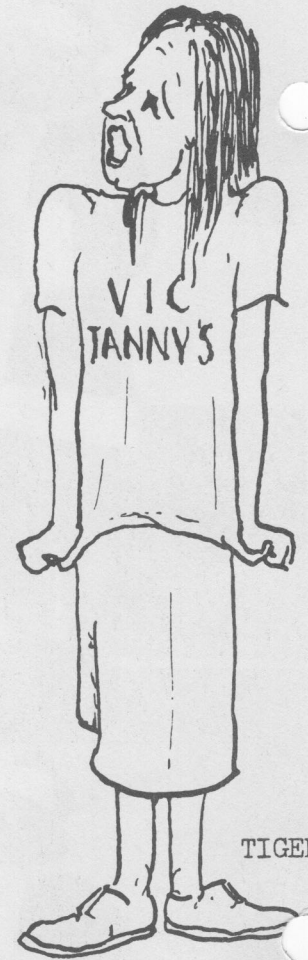

*What is 200% of zero?*

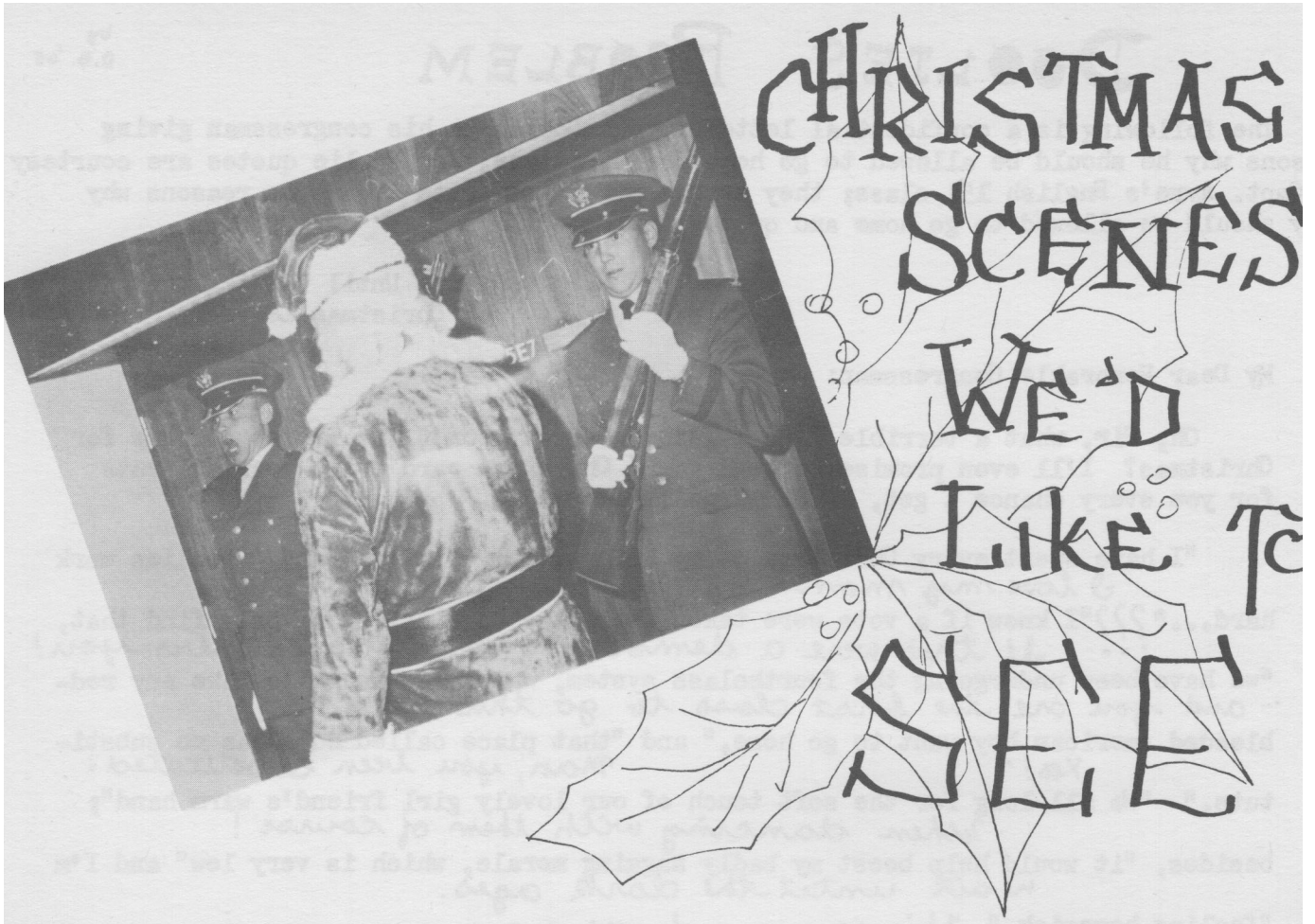
"Therefore with such overwhelming arguments, refusal to comply shows the lack of understanding of the non-understanding officers." *you've got that right.*

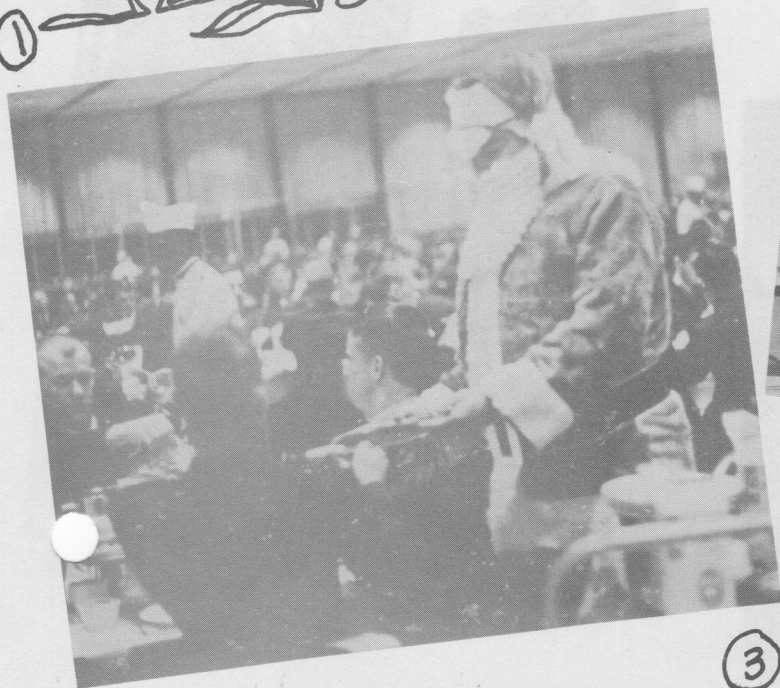
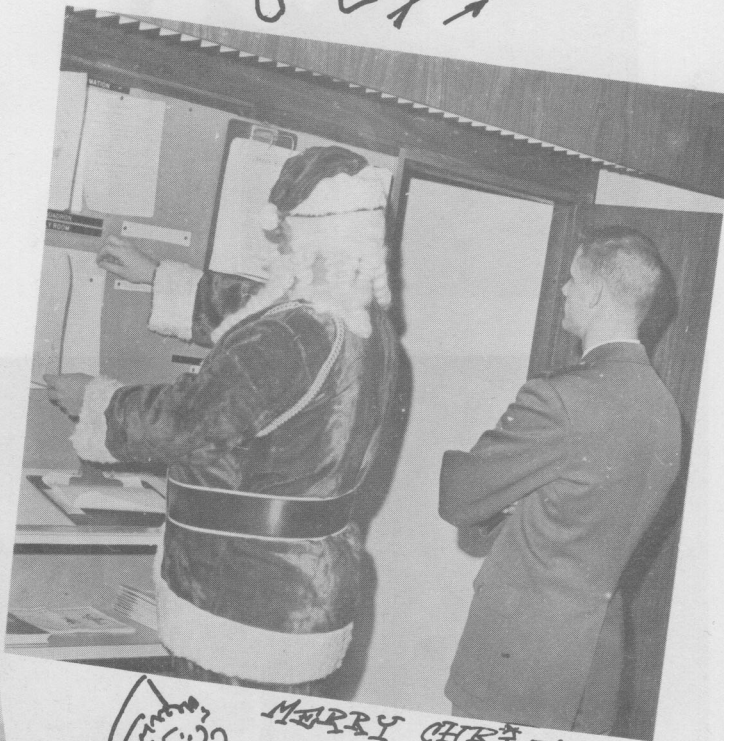
