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
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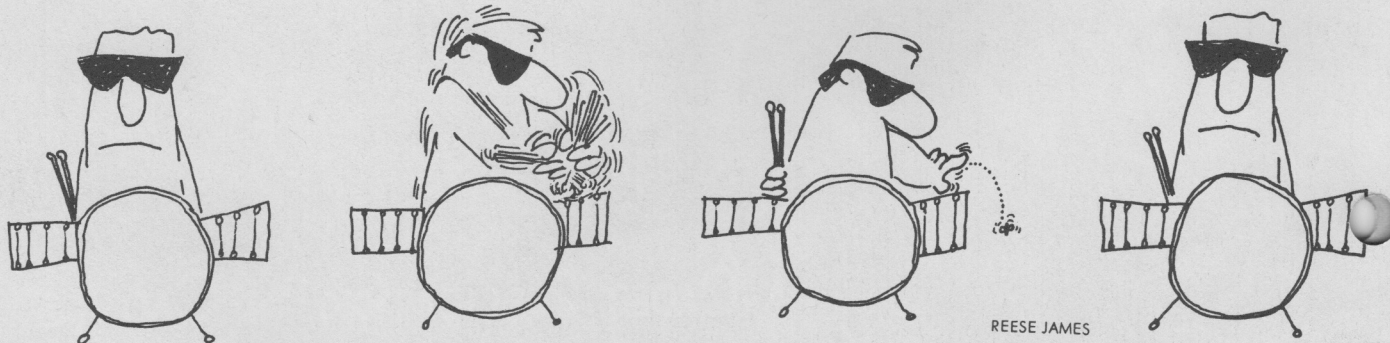
Subscribers:

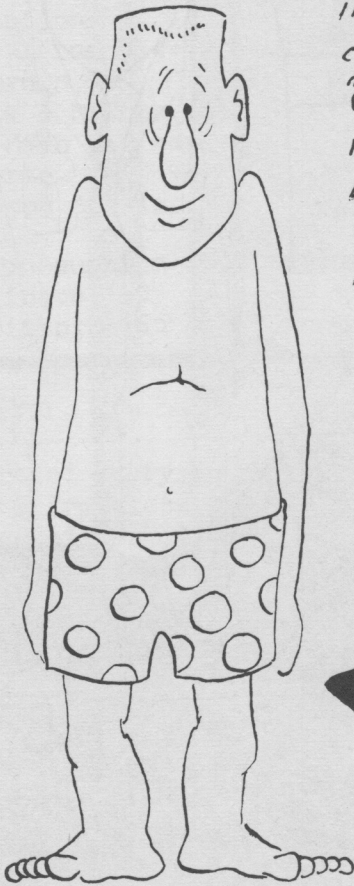

CUT-OUTS for CADETS

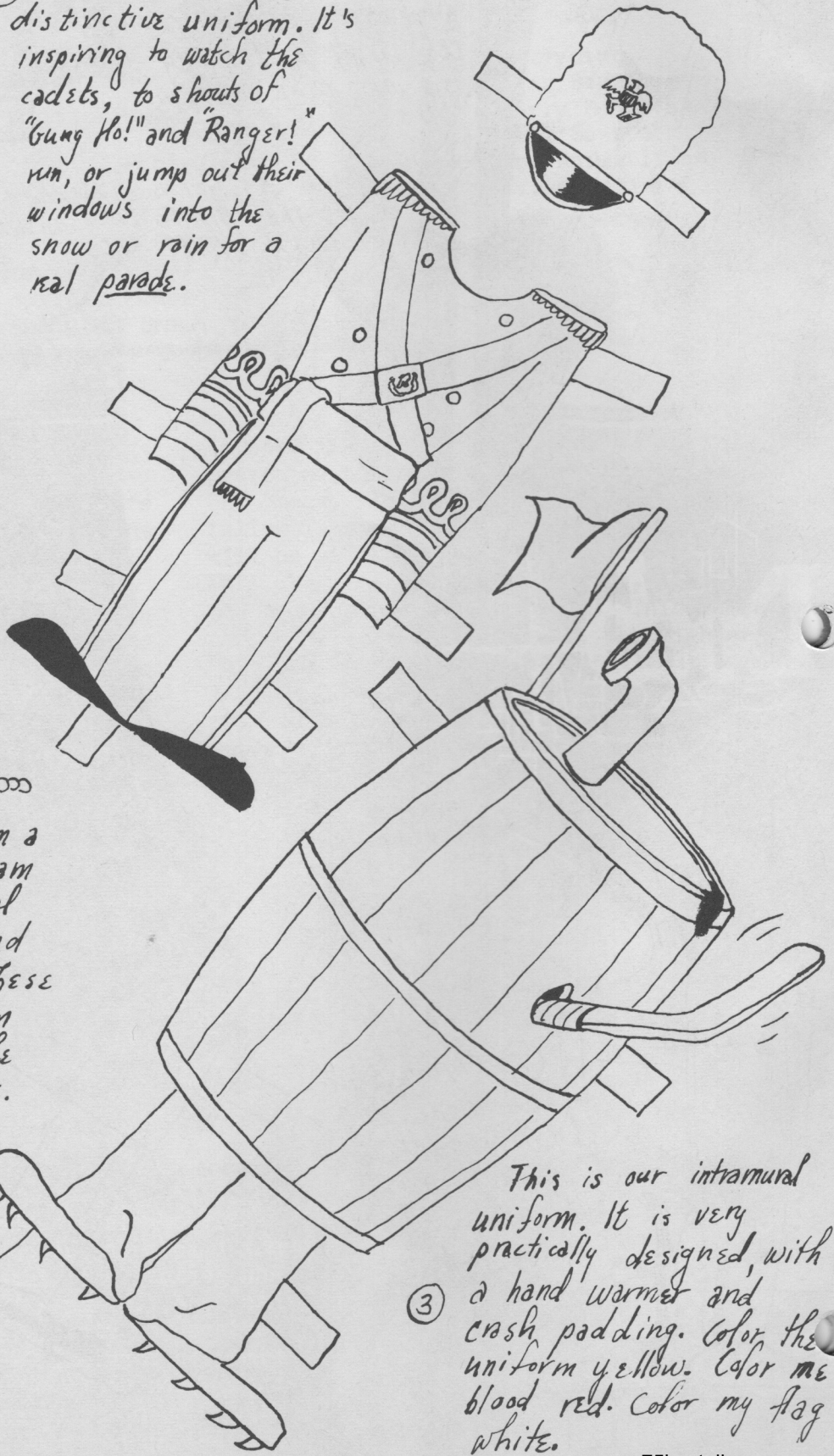

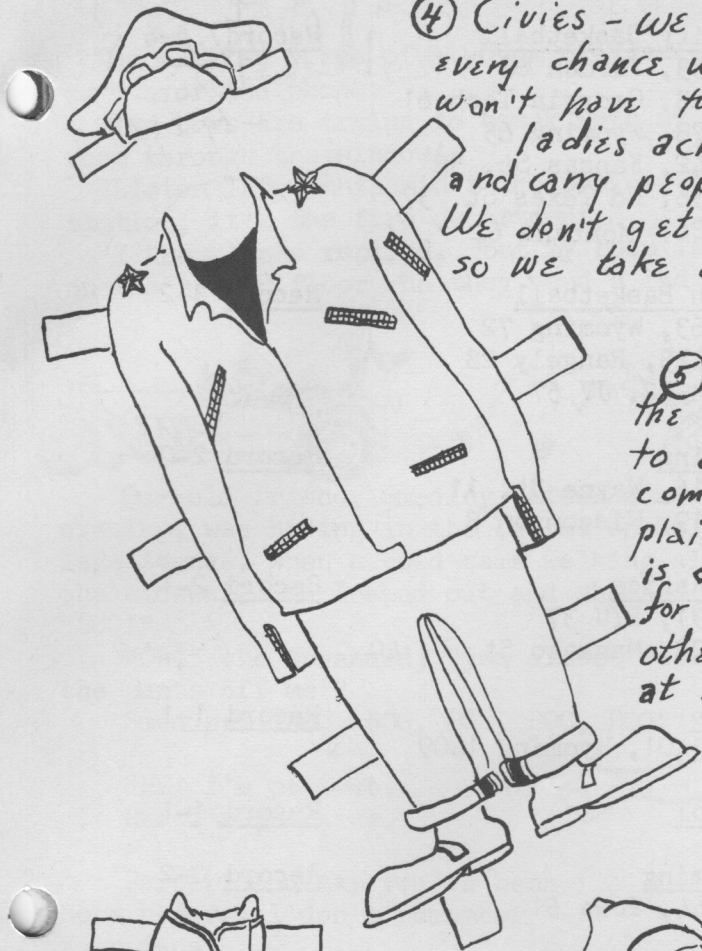

①½ Hat - probably blown off in a wind-storm.

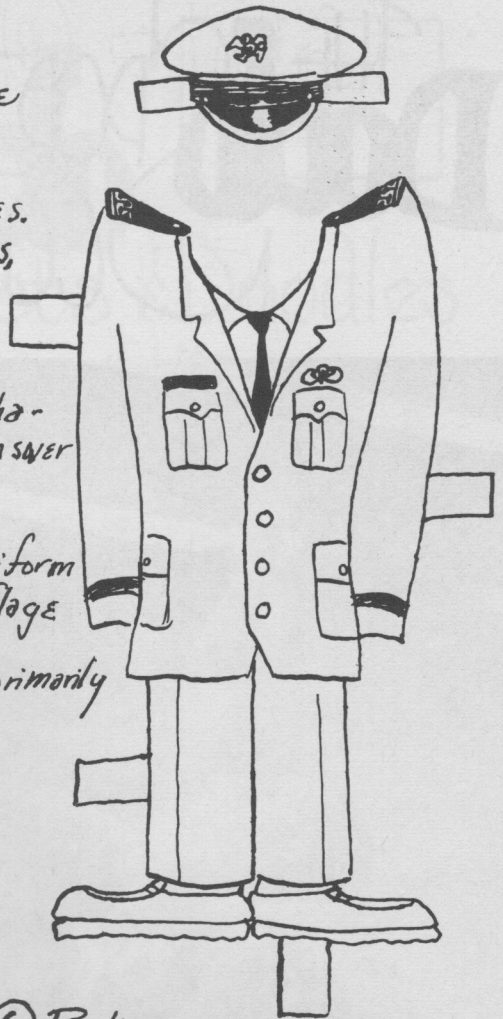


③ This is our intramural uniform. It is very practically designed, with a hand warmer and crash padding. Color the uniform yellow. Color me blood red. Color my flag white.

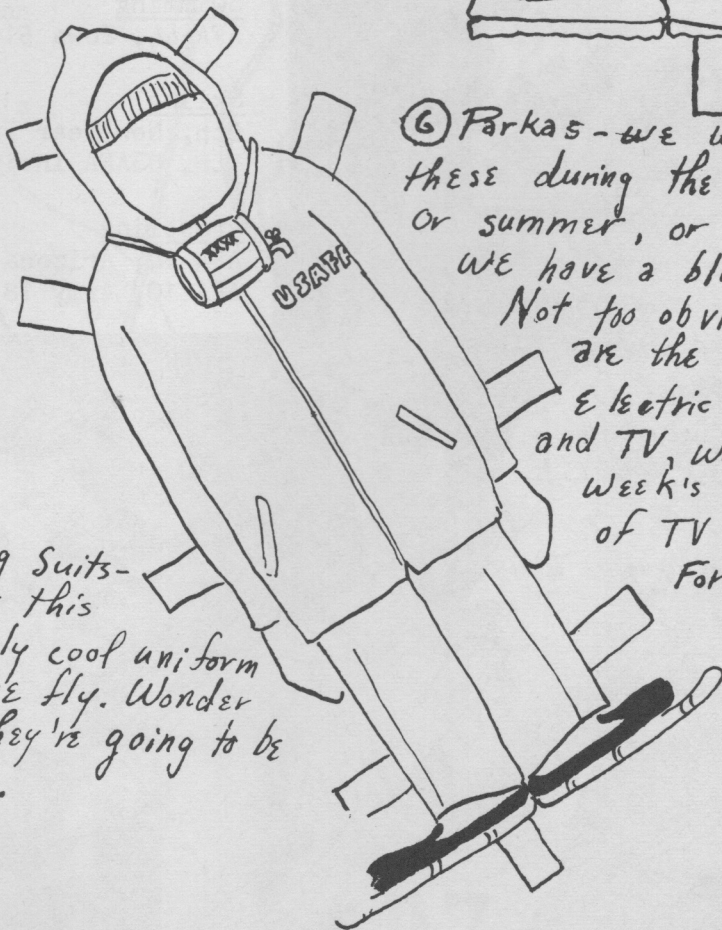
④ Civies - We wear civies every chance we get, so we won't have to help old ladies across streets and carry people's suitcases. We don't get many chances, so we take a few.



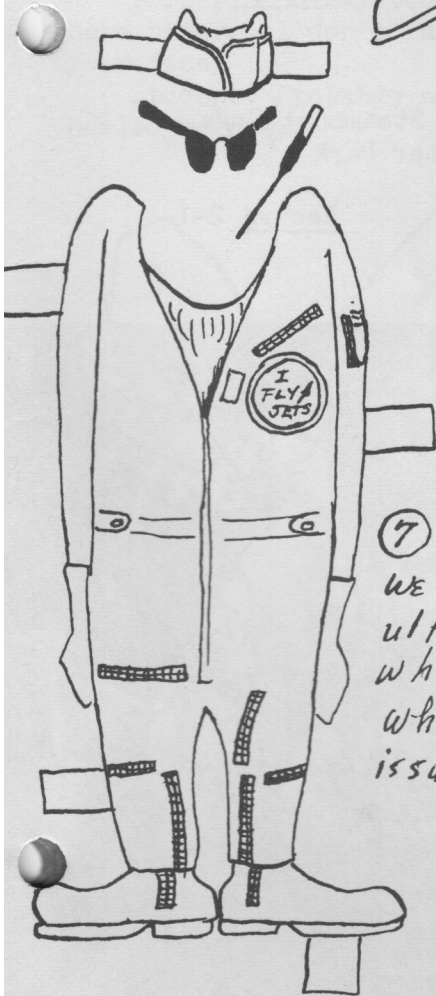

HE: I'm practice.

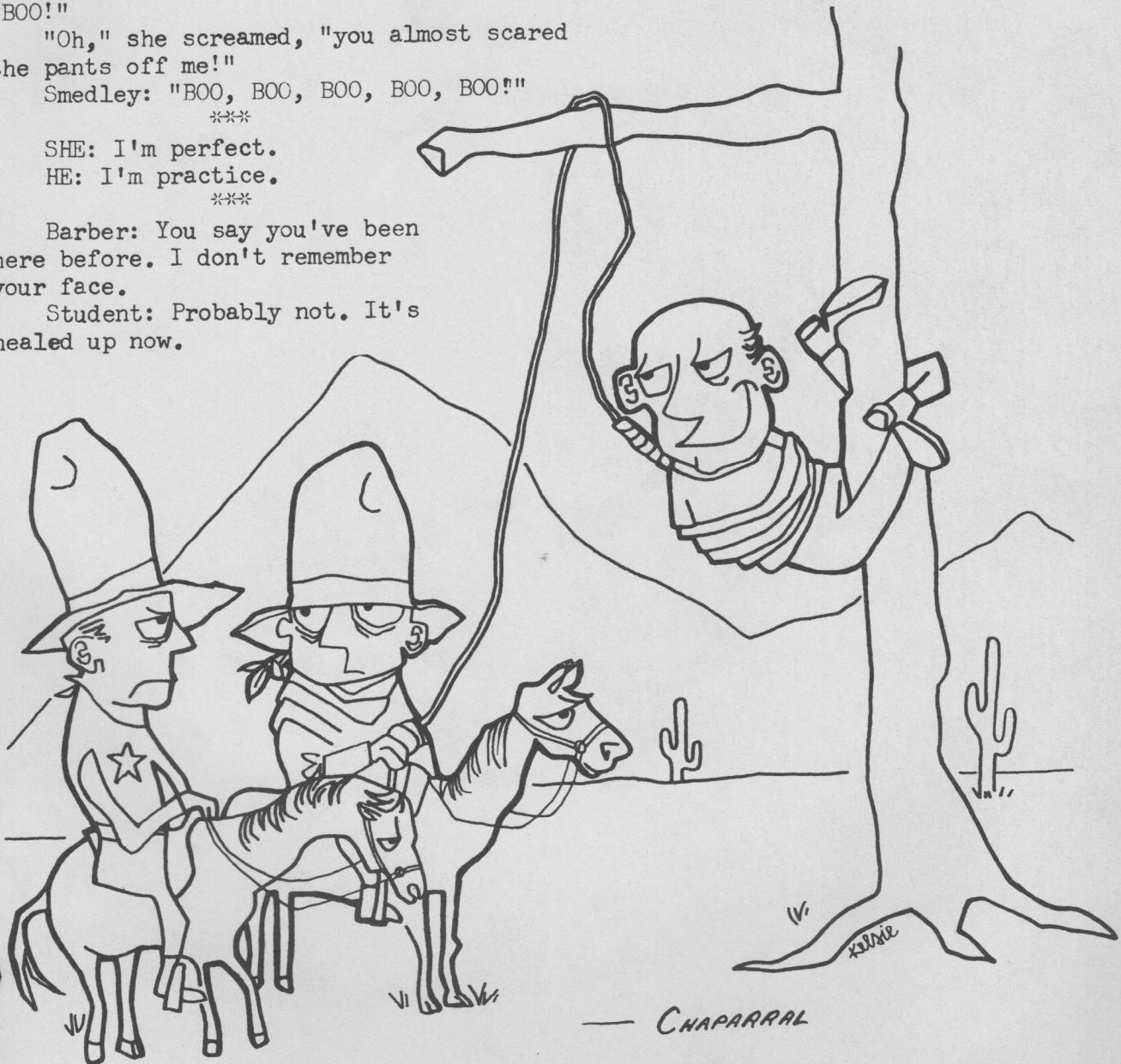

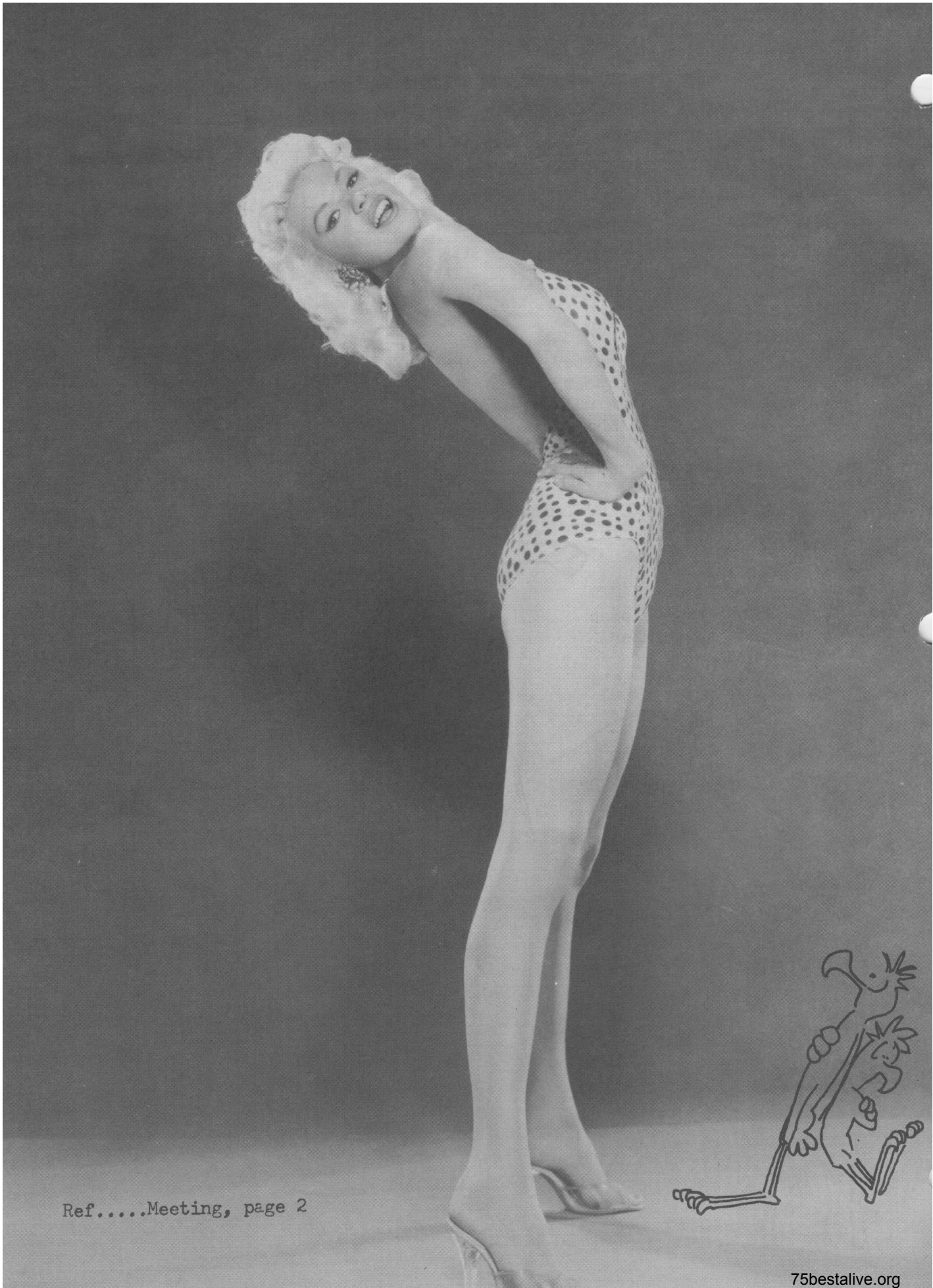
