

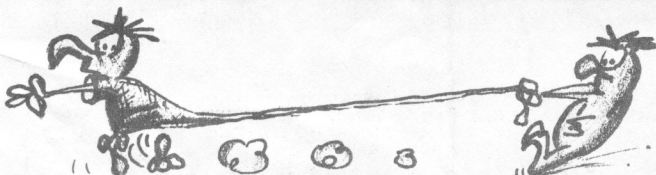

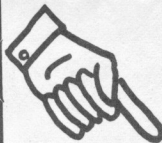

RAWALPINDI, Pakistan —(AP)— U.N. Secretary-General U Thant left by plane for New Delhi Saturday after two days of apparently fruitless talks with Pakistani officials. The talks, according to all indications, produced little progress toward a means of achieving a cease-fire with India. Thant conferred with President Ayub Khan and Foreign Minister Z. A. Bhutto.
In Moscow Saturday, Premier Alexei N. Kosygin appealed to India and Pakistan to stop fighting, and put his support behind Thant's efforts for a cease-fire.
