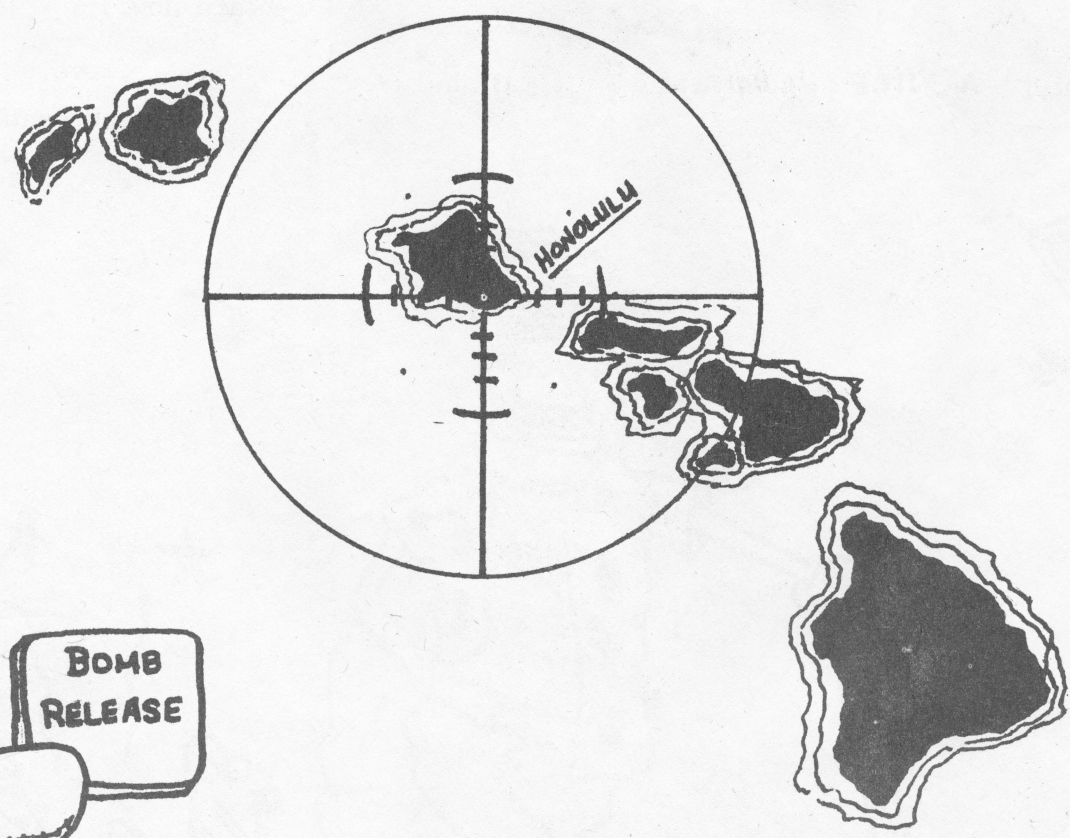

The University of Hawaii brings its Rainbows to Falcon Stadium this weekend in search of their **second** football victory. Although they are **1** and **2** they are a big, strong team with a lot of desire and are really looking for that **next** big win. They are a young team and they never quit regardless of the score making them far from a pushover.

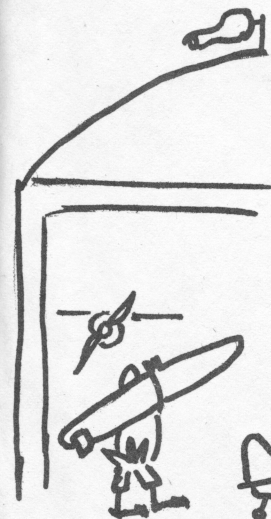
Hawaii shapes up pretty well on offense, led by junior quarterback Larry Zenker (5-11, 190) from Sacramento, California. He's of the Paul Stein variety - a nifty runner and an above average passer.

Another quarterback who may see a lot of action is senior Joe Sarboe (who just happens to be the son of the coach.) Although not as good a runner as is Zenker, Sarboe is a great passer; one of the best that Falcon Stadium will see this year.

Hawaii's big gun in the backfield is senior half-back Ben Ronquilio (5-7, 170). He's a real sprinter and is the team's leading pass receiver as well as being the leading ground gainer.

Defensively, the Rainbows are big and alert and have a very good pass rush. Some indication of their size is given by the starting tackles Ed Mihevic (6-6, 235) and Jon Cox (6-5, 255) - and their replacements are 250 and 265! The primary defensive alignments they will use are the 6-1 and 6-2.

All in all, this weekend's contest should prove to be another good test of our 1966 Falcons, who may have a tendency to look ahead to the 15th and the University of Oregon.

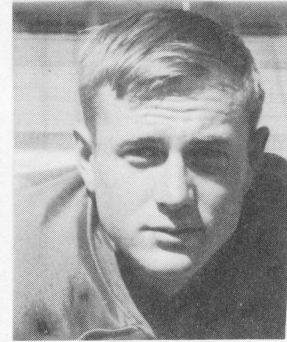


NAVY GAME STARS

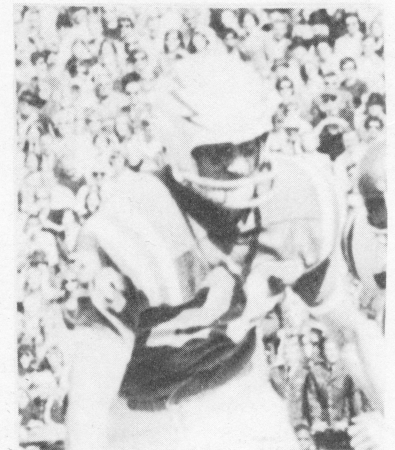

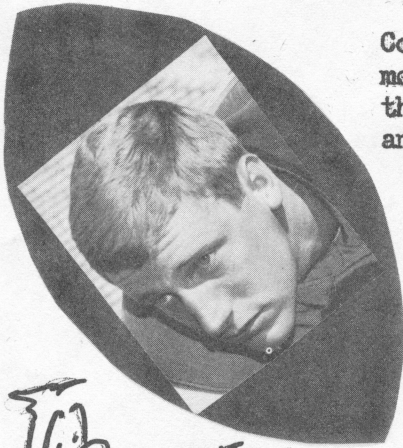

STICKY FINGERED FALCONS



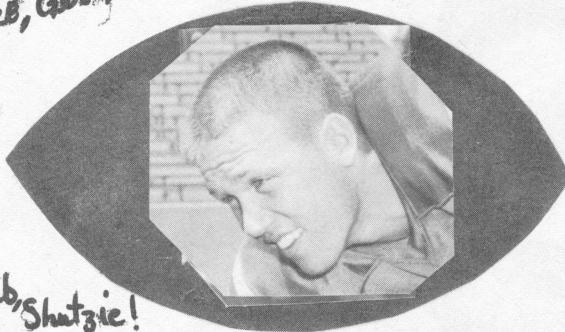
Corns (88) came up with some fine moves and two clutch catches versus the Middies Sat. He's a Tight End and calls Wauwatosa, Wis. home

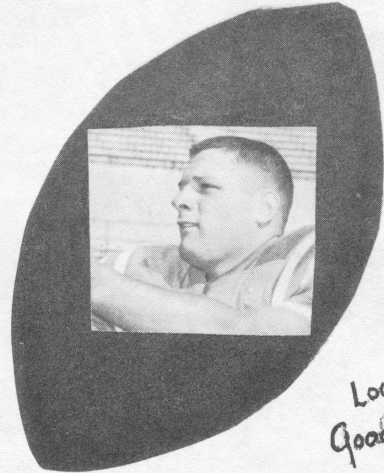
The Whale (87) is one of the most consistent pass-snaggers around and is having his usual fine season at Split End. When he goes home, it's to Chicago.

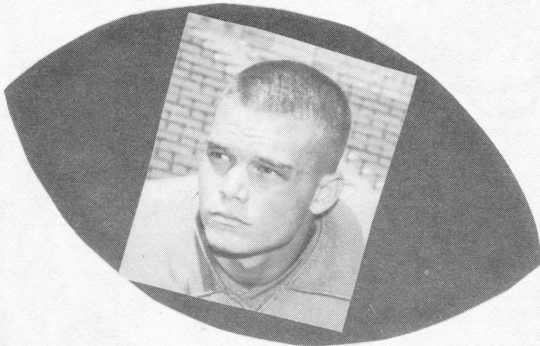
