Dodo Interview: MIKE RENGEL

a candid conversation with the noted defensive tactician of the Falcon football team

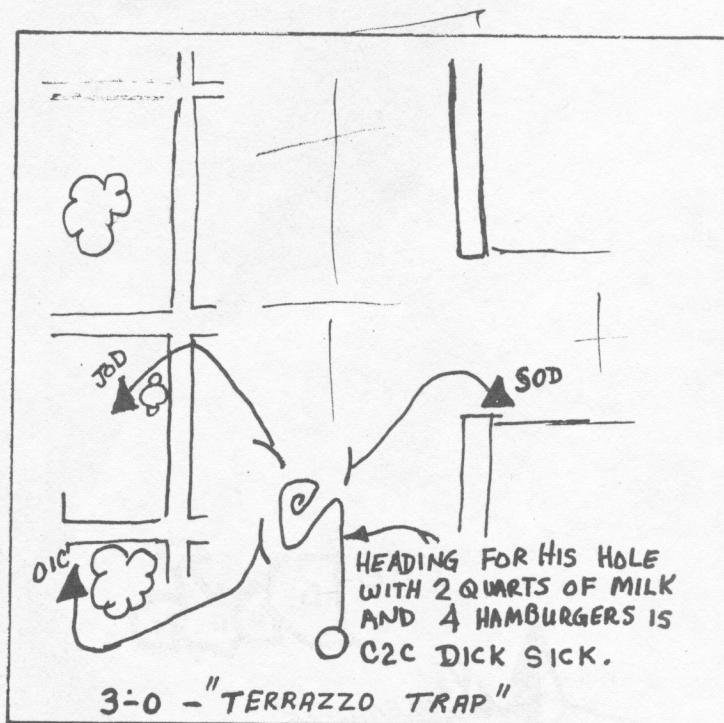
Mike Rengel entered USAFA with the still civilian class of '68 and became a member of the Falcon football team. He walks, talks, and mostly sleeps football, making him highly qualified for the topic of this Dodo Interview: "What to look for when the wing clashes with their toughest opponent this year--Security Flight."

DODO: Mike, has Suc Flight changed their basic offense since last season?

RENGEL: Wit respect ta dere players, dere still running from da wing, wit such standouts as da SOD, IOD, JOD, and two NCOD's. Dey have managed ta really add a lot of punch by adding some OIC's wit a lot of speed.

DODO: Let's get into some specifics, Mike; what have they got in the way of surprises this year?

RENGEL: Uh, one thing dey can do ta upset da timing of our aspiring cadets is ta red-dog da food-sneaker back. Ta counter dis defense, a lot of ingenuity must be used during da warm weather; during da winter, we can rely on da hidden ball trick.



DODO: Is this all we have to watch out for?

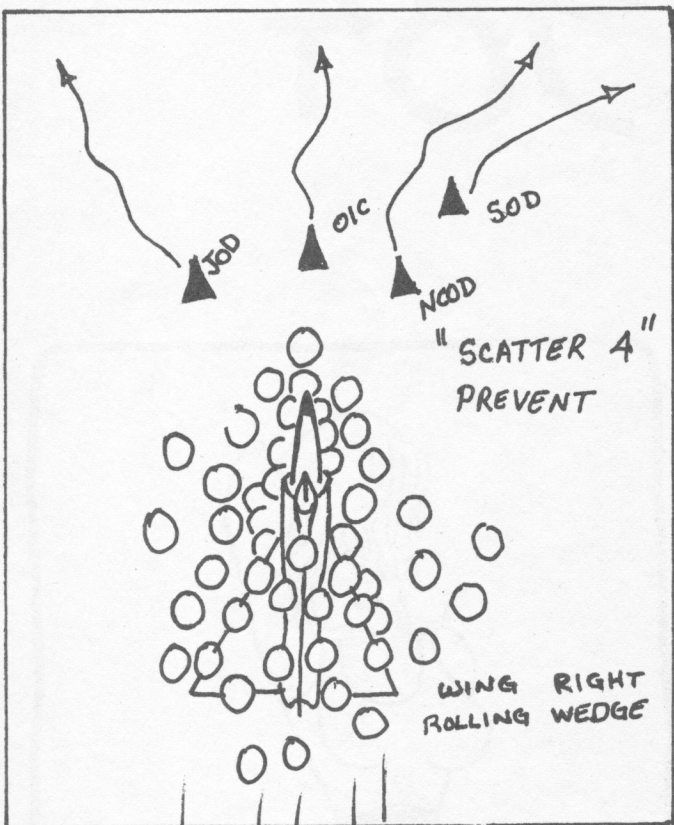
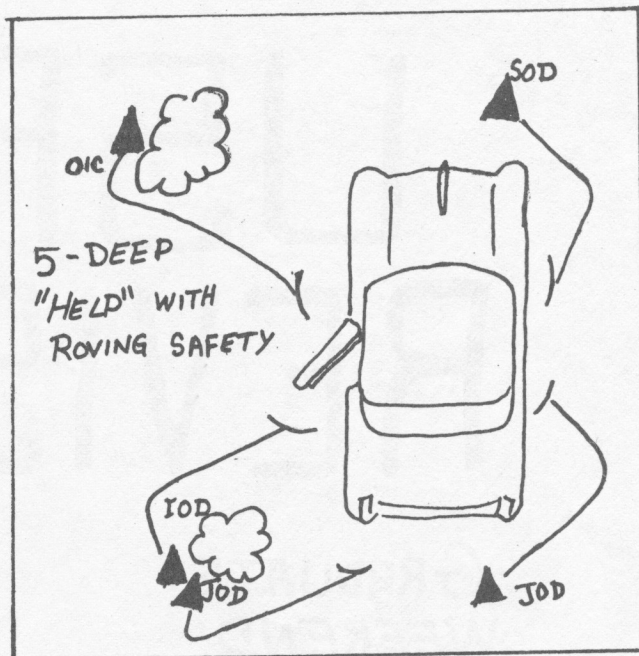

RENGEL: Yah, dey got a really great one dat dey run quite often; most of da guys have of course heard of "Cream da Message" and its usual follow-up, "Security Flight Out". Another oldy to watch for when da weather gets bad is "Da Razzle-Dazzle Uniform Change" which in reality is just a triple reverse which comes up da middle.

DODO: Another item that the wing has deep interest in is the Arnold Hall offense. Can you tell us anything about this?

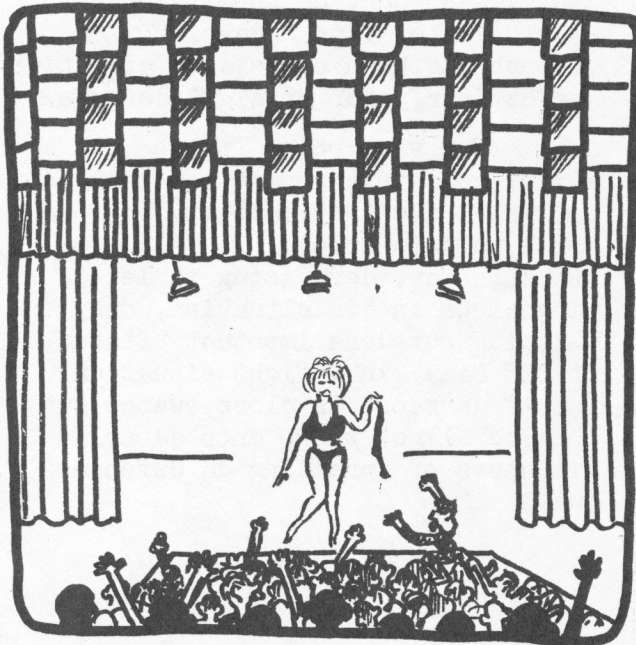

When Suc Flight finds it hard, ta grind out da first downs, dey'll withdraw into a deep punt formation, fake da kick, and instead slide one over into da flat. 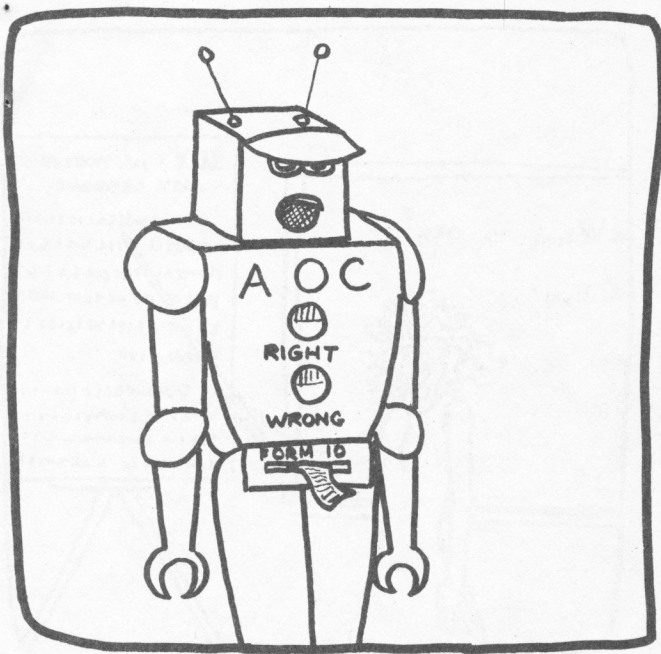

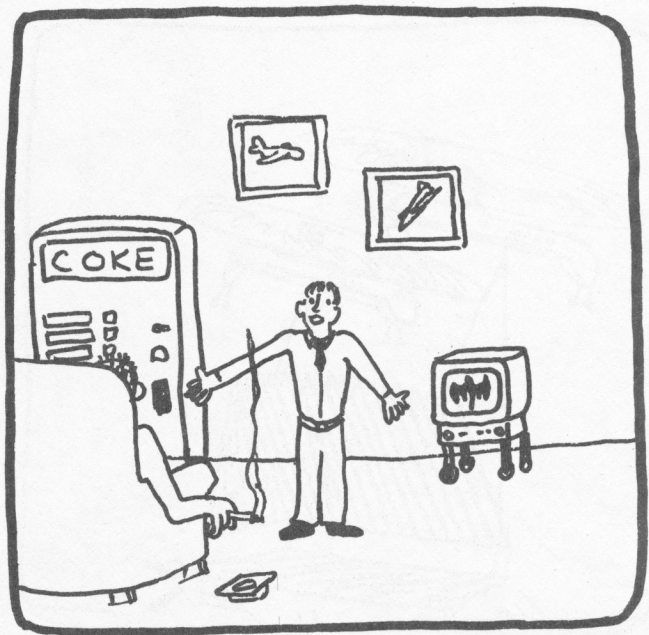


Your first stop will be the cadet social center, Arnold A-go-go. You will discover that the Arnold Hall of yesterday has changed in a few respects.

Moving to Vandenburg Hall #1, we have our first glimpse of the A.O.C. of the future.



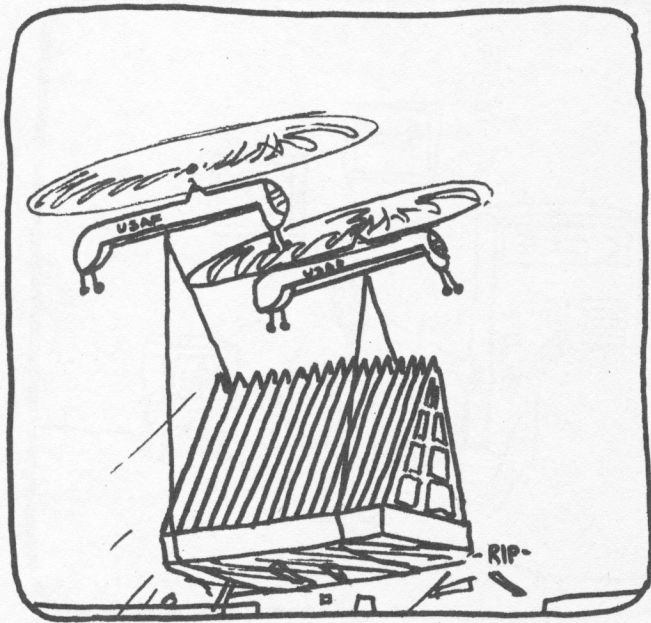
... here is a typical scene of an upperclassman correcting a doolie:

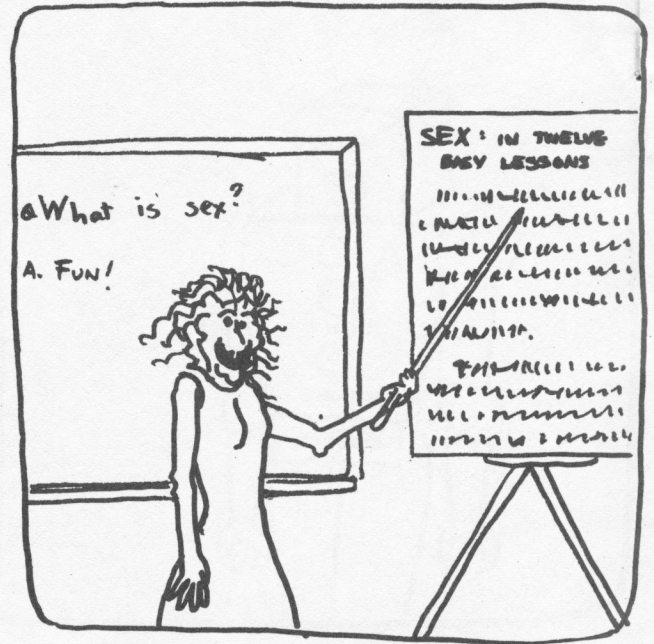
Mitchell Hall has since done away with its army of waiters and turned into the world's largest vendo-mat.



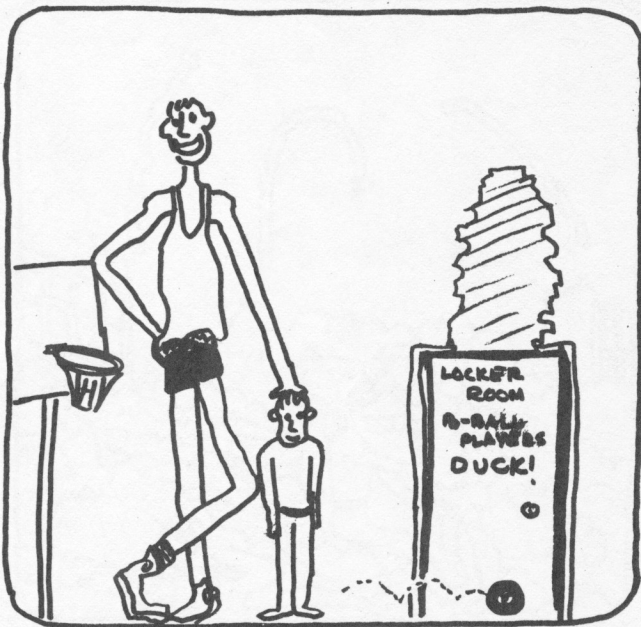
The installation of Vandenburg Hall #2 has resulted in several creative inter-dormitory activities.



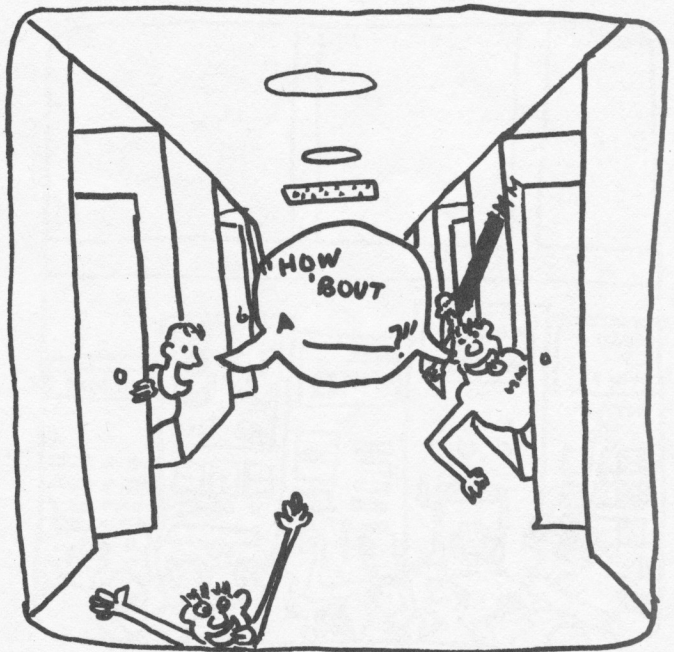
The passion cadets once possessed for moving the F-106 has given way to something of a broader, different nature.

However, there is one aspect of Academy life that hasn't changed in the least.

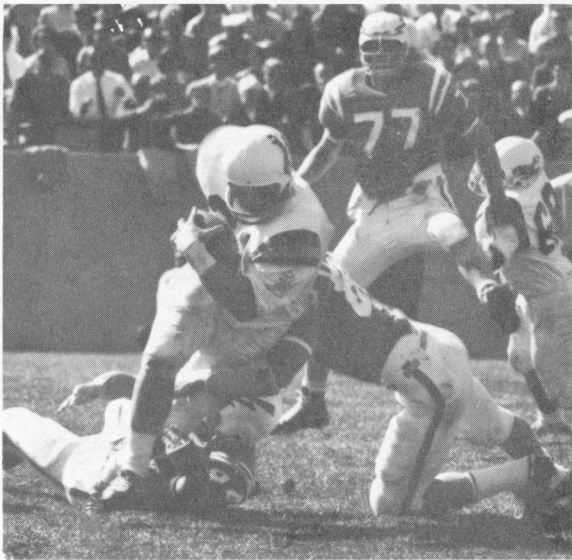

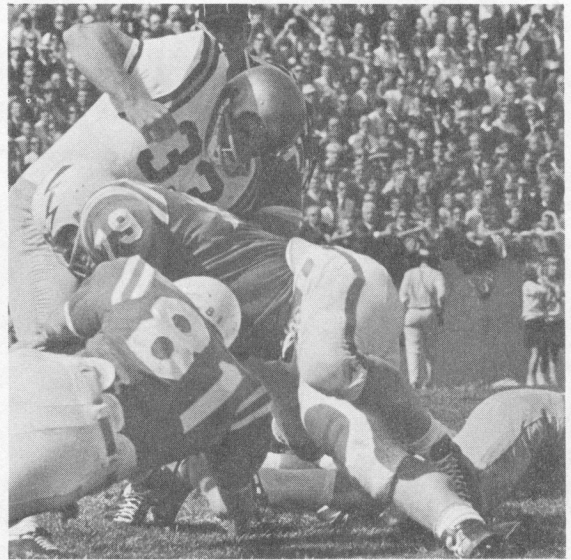

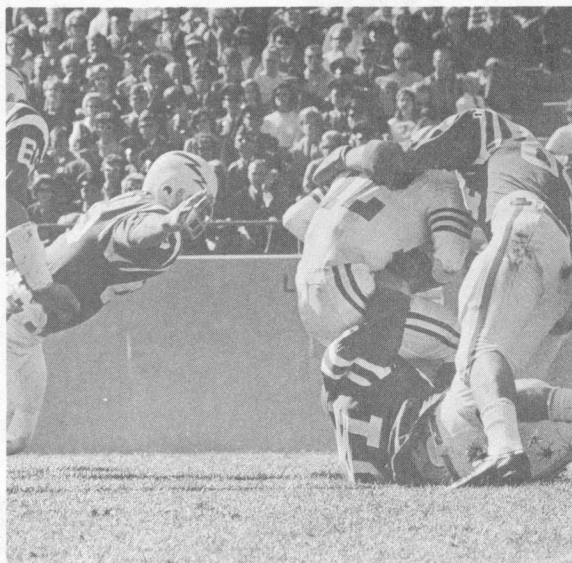

Jocko and Mike stuff a Middle-- he fumbled too.

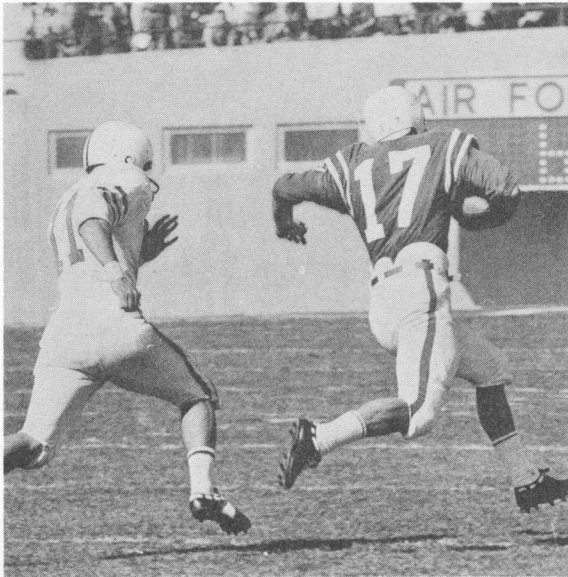

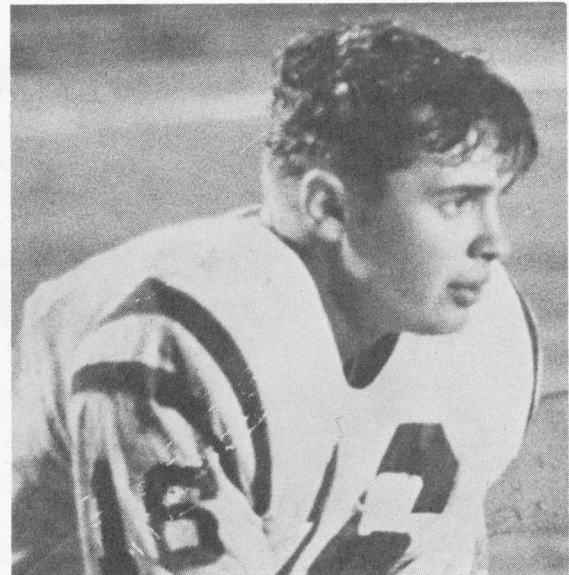

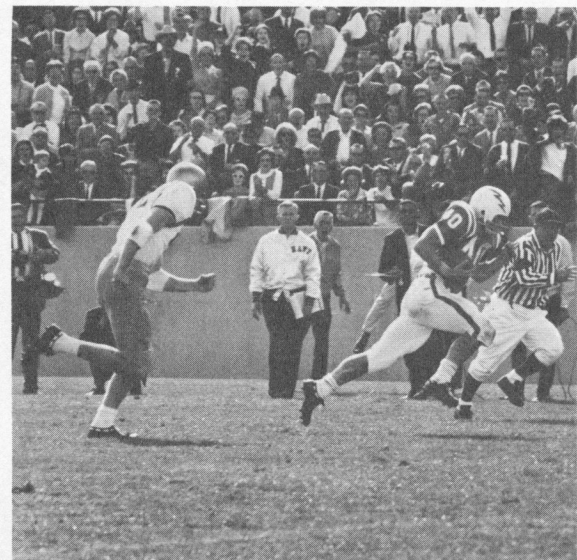
Craig outhustles a Hawaii defender to paydirt and adds six more to the Falcon total.



Little Stevie Turner takes a well-deserved break during the first quarter at UCLA.

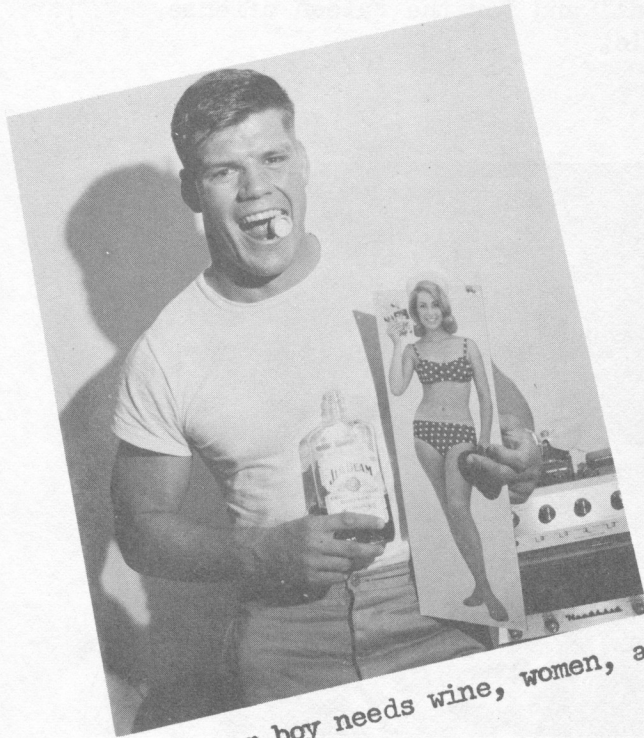


Cooke carries the mail into the Navy line behind fine blocks by Scotty and Dennis.

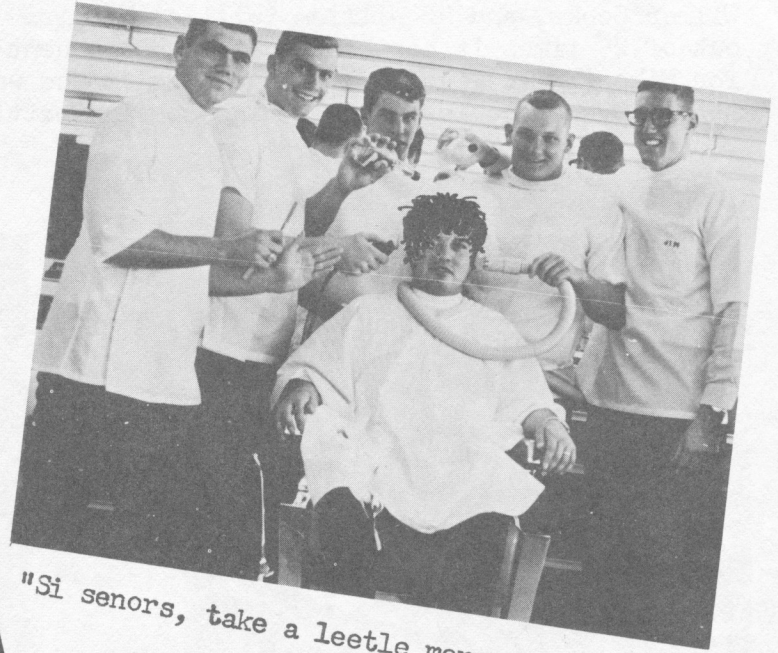


The crowd goes wild as Mike breaks into the clear late in the Navy game.

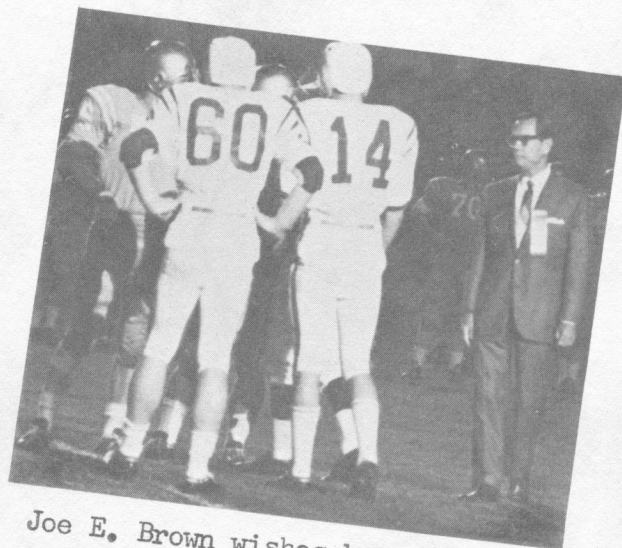

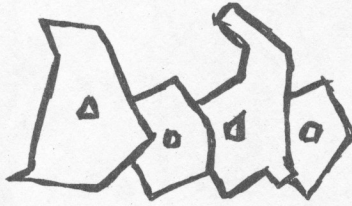
