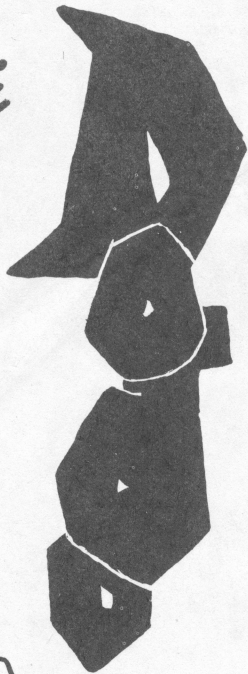
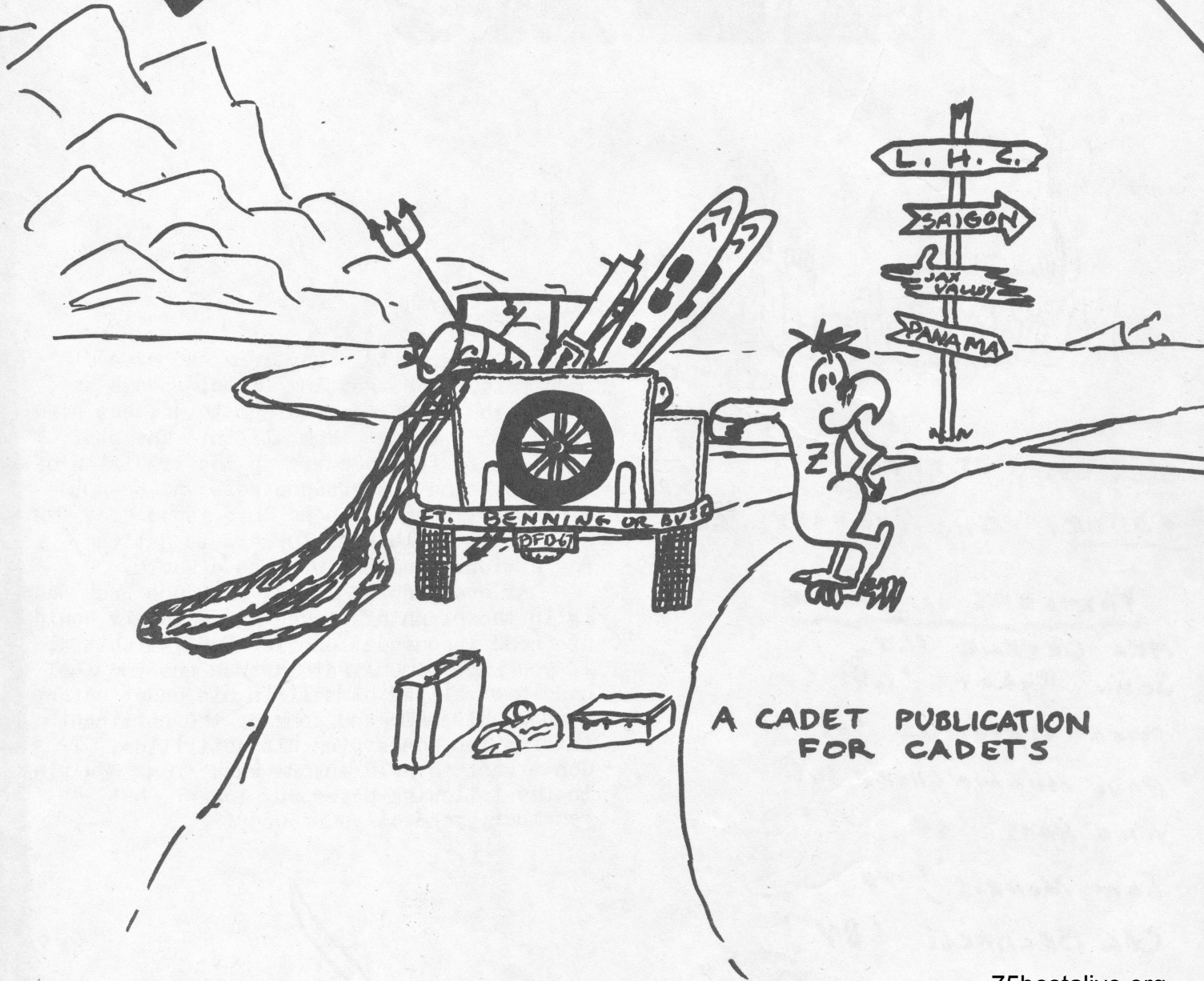

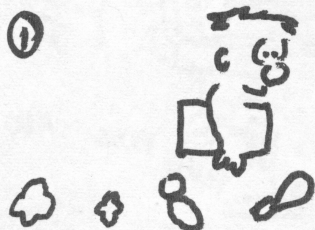


THE BIG BUCK-UP

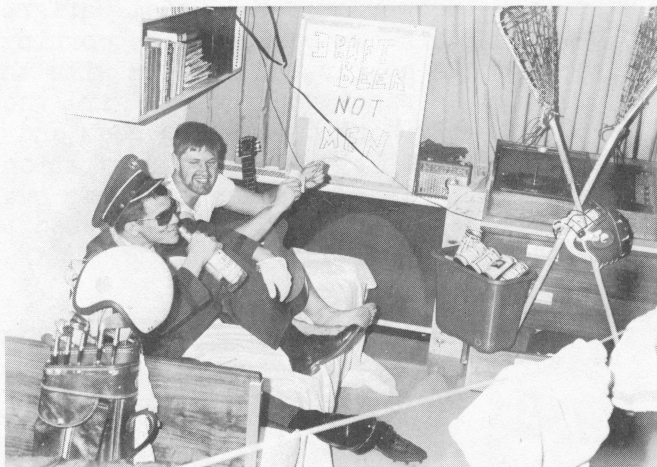
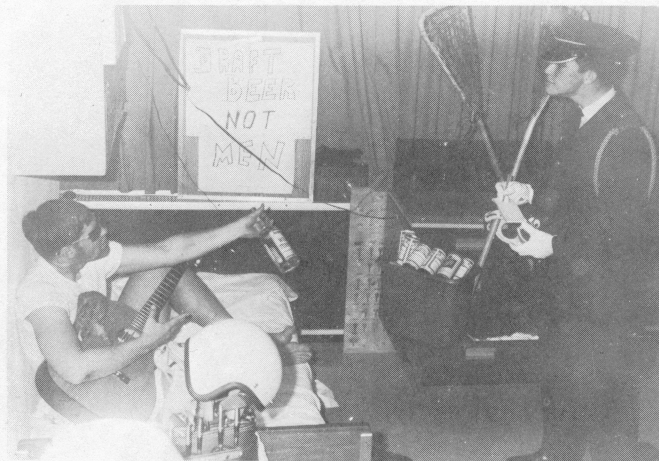

Option #2-Take 2 days summer leave. Report to Lackland AFB for 36 days of hazing newly inducted piece marchers.

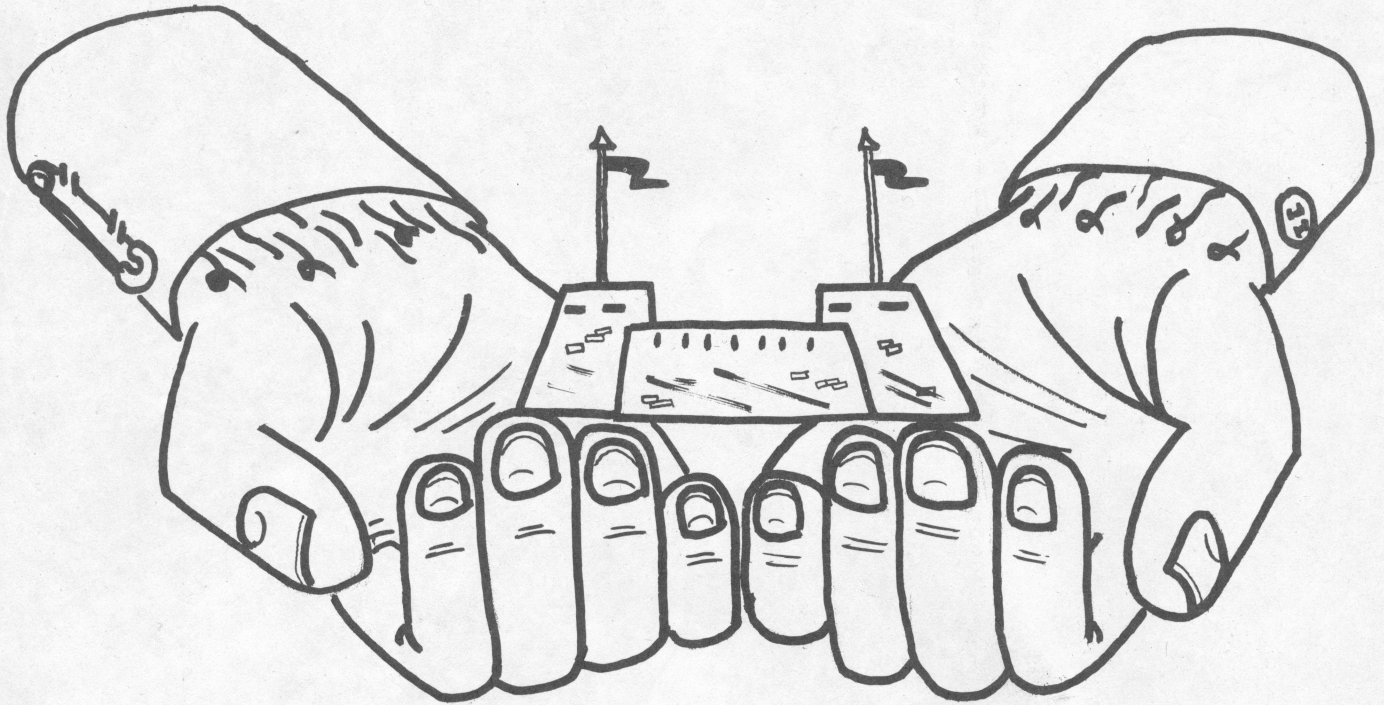
Class of '67:
