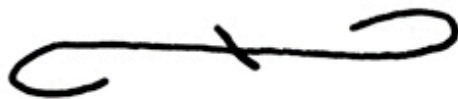
Frederic B Guerrina- Well, ole' Flick is

Even the ever-prepared defenders of Apple Pie, Motherhood, and Retreat (i.e. Security Flight) are caught in their natural, active state.

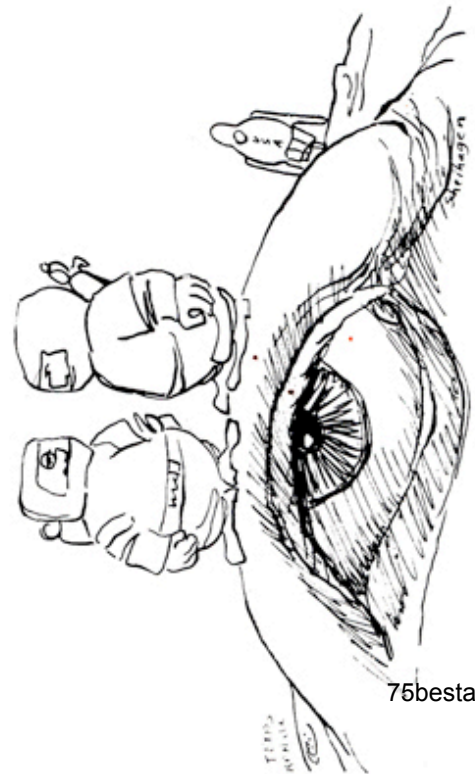

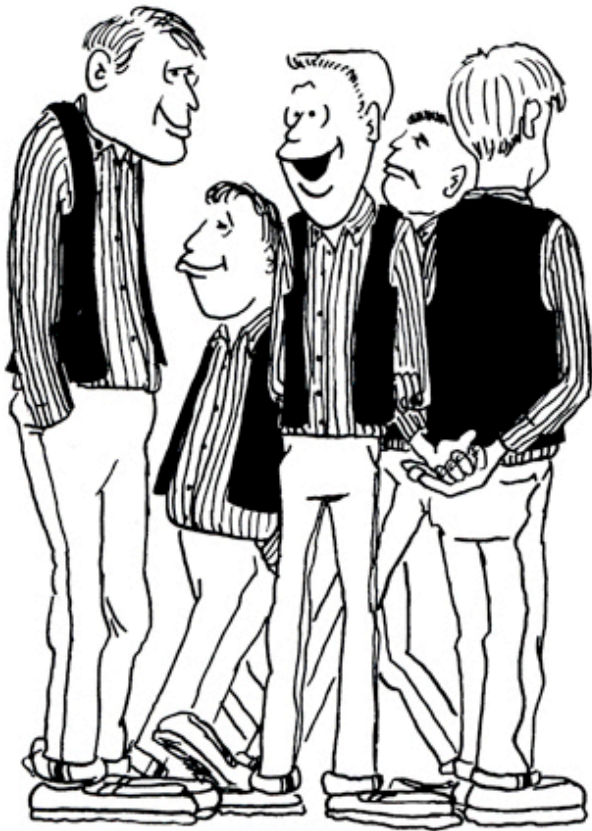

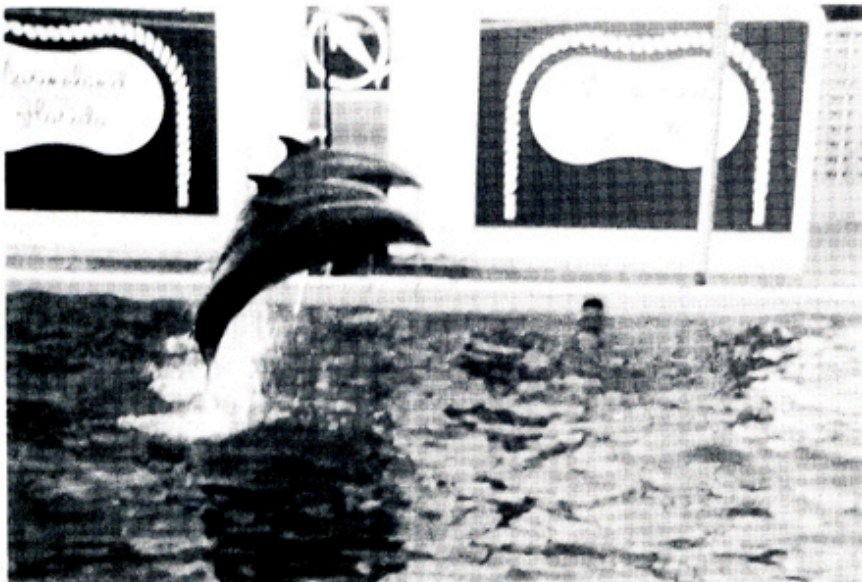

But I'm not usually real quick in shaking the sandman and I felt like I was missing something all morning.

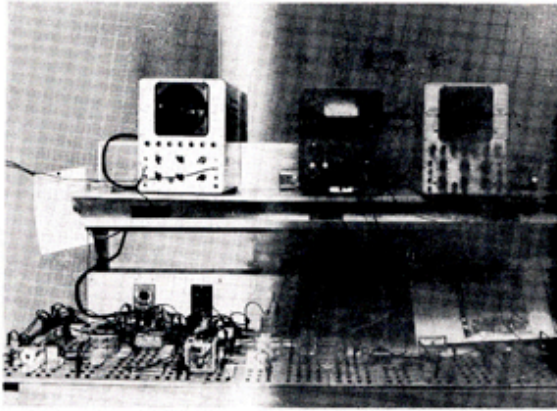


After a good night's sleep I stood around with the guys waiting to march over to Mitch's.

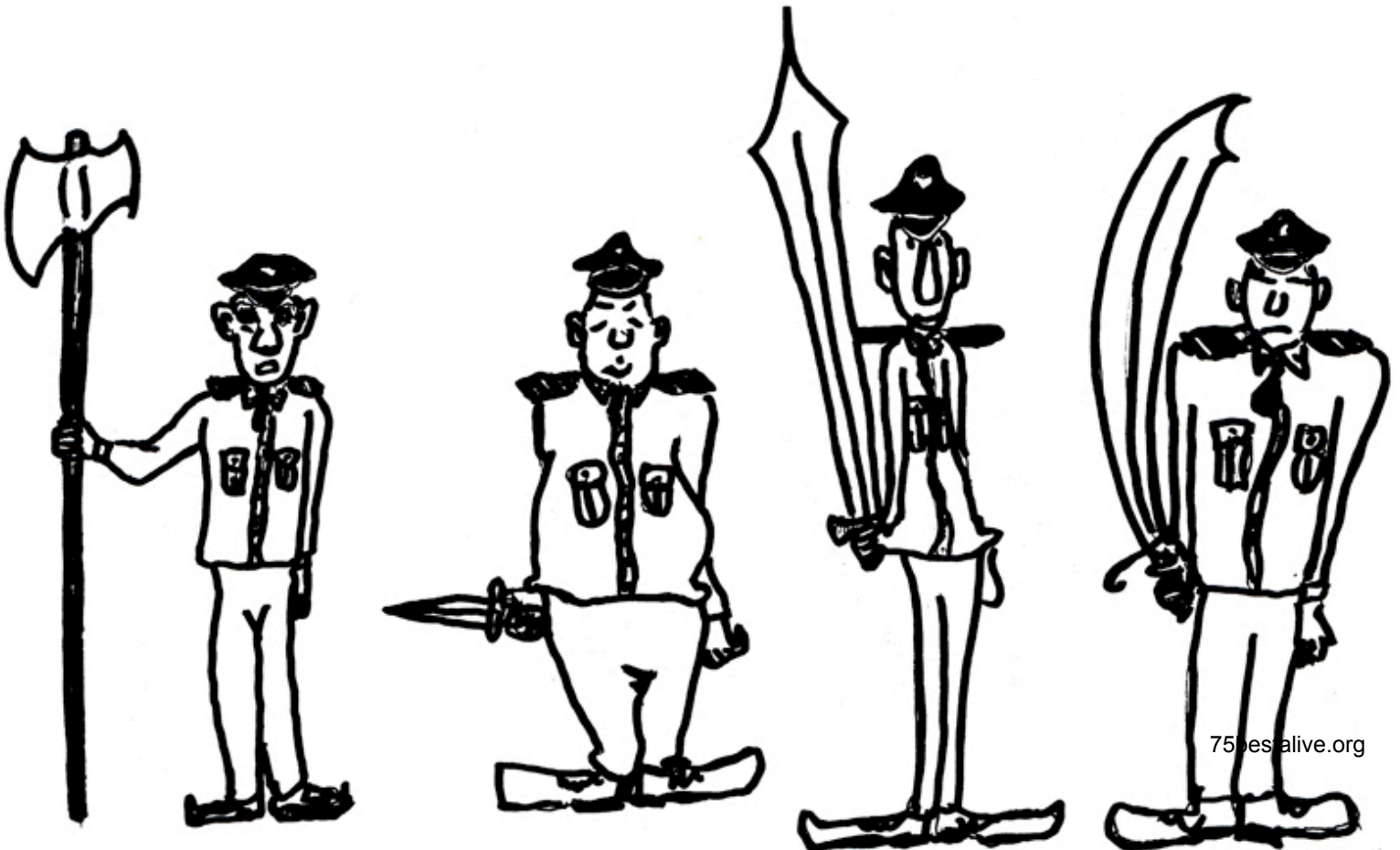
Liquor in room ---\$50

You may also participate in your own behalf (knee pads \$2 extra). Shoulder pads and cushioned shoes are provided free of charge to ease your marching hours.

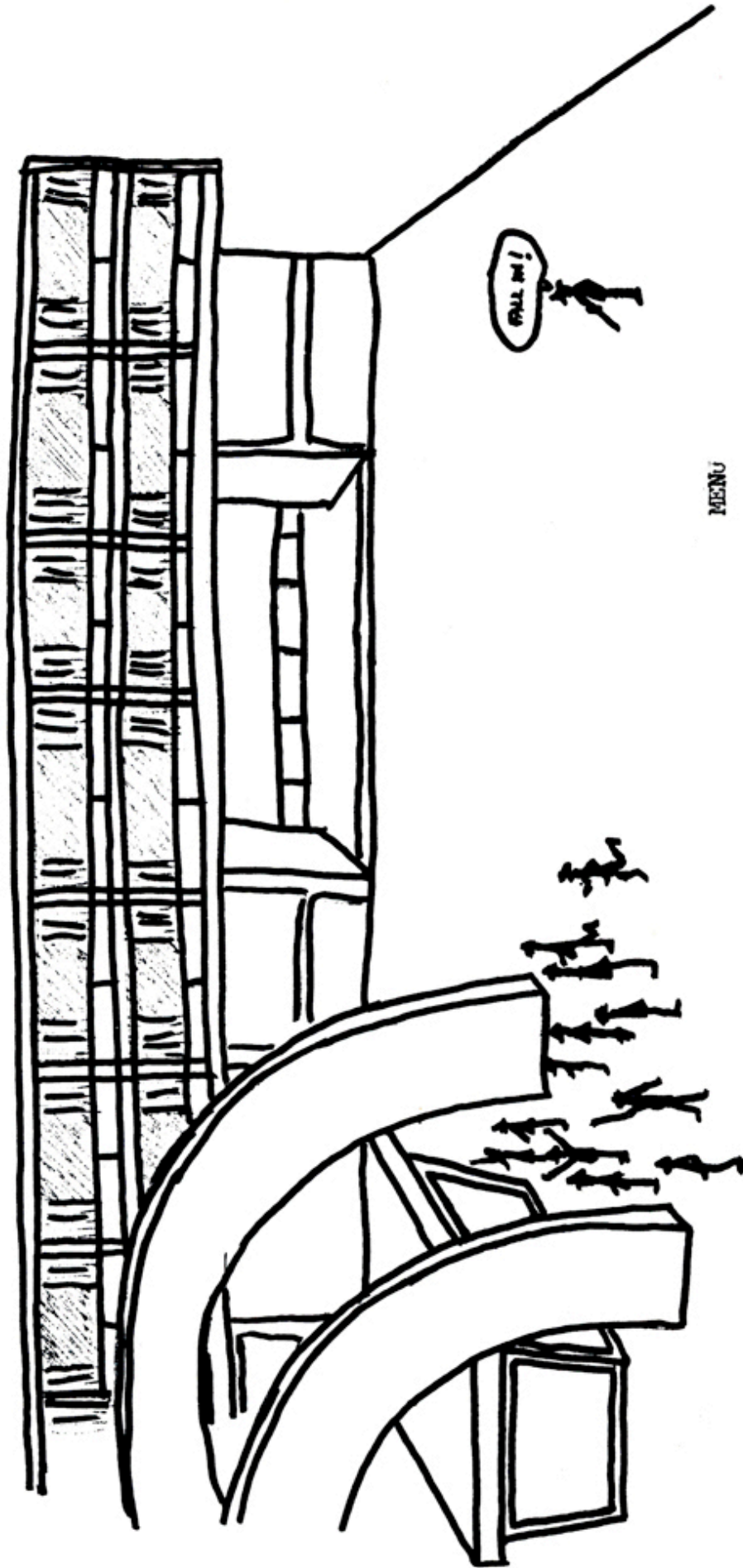
