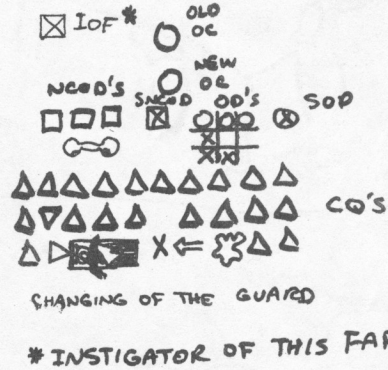
# THE ~~Old~~ ~~is~~ ~~MAKES~~ ~~WAY~~ for the ~~NEW~~

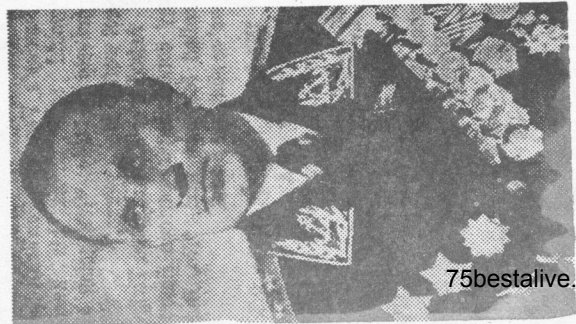

# Dorm, one each - new

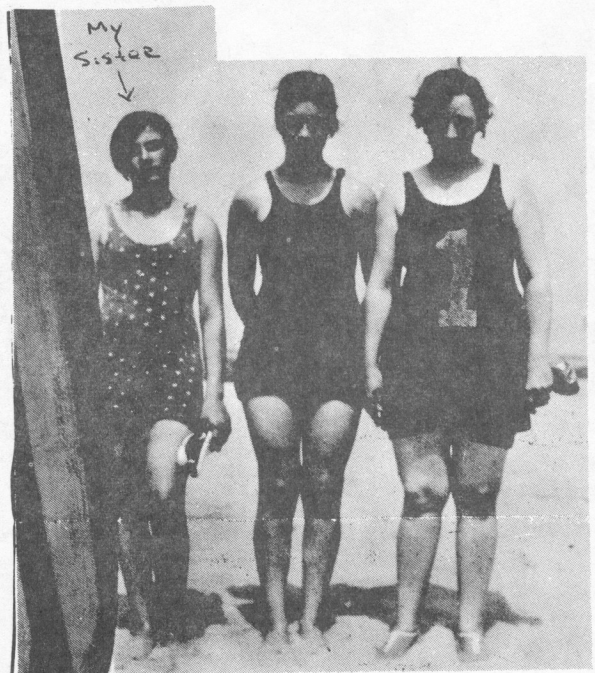
