The Falcons started off the '68 season with a bang against Florida. Curtis Martin raced 98 yards with the opening kickoff and then the Gators knew they were in for an afternoon of football.

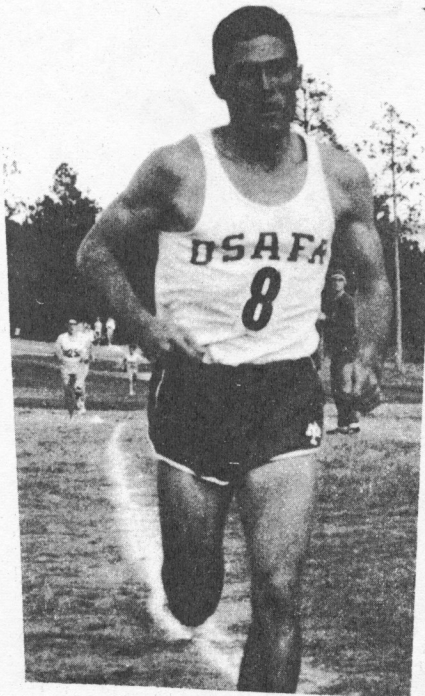
With Marietta, Epping, and company consistently pulling down the Florida quarterbacks, and Spider and the boys working over the defense, it looked as though the upset of the season was in the making. But no, one puny cloud -the only one in the sky- saw fit to dump on Tampa Stadium and that was the end of the dream. With the final score 23-20, about all that could be said about the Florida team was "If they're #5, we're #6". As for their coach, who said before the game that he wouldn't intentionally run up the score, about all we can say is "Gee thanks, coach, for being such a swell guy and giving us a break"?

The next Saturday saw us pitted against the #20 team in the nation, Wyoming. This was also to be a Saturday of the fallen records. The Cowboys had not been beaten by an Academy team since '62, the longest modern collegiate field goal was 56 yards, and Wyoming had scored a TD in every one of their last 27 games. All of these were to fall before the afternoon was over.

Interceptions by Hallenbeck saw to it that the Cowboys were not to get any more than their allocated 3 points. Final score AFA-10, Wyoming-3.

Also, that CSU weekend will feature the #1 meet of the cross country season with the top teams from last year running right here at old AFA. 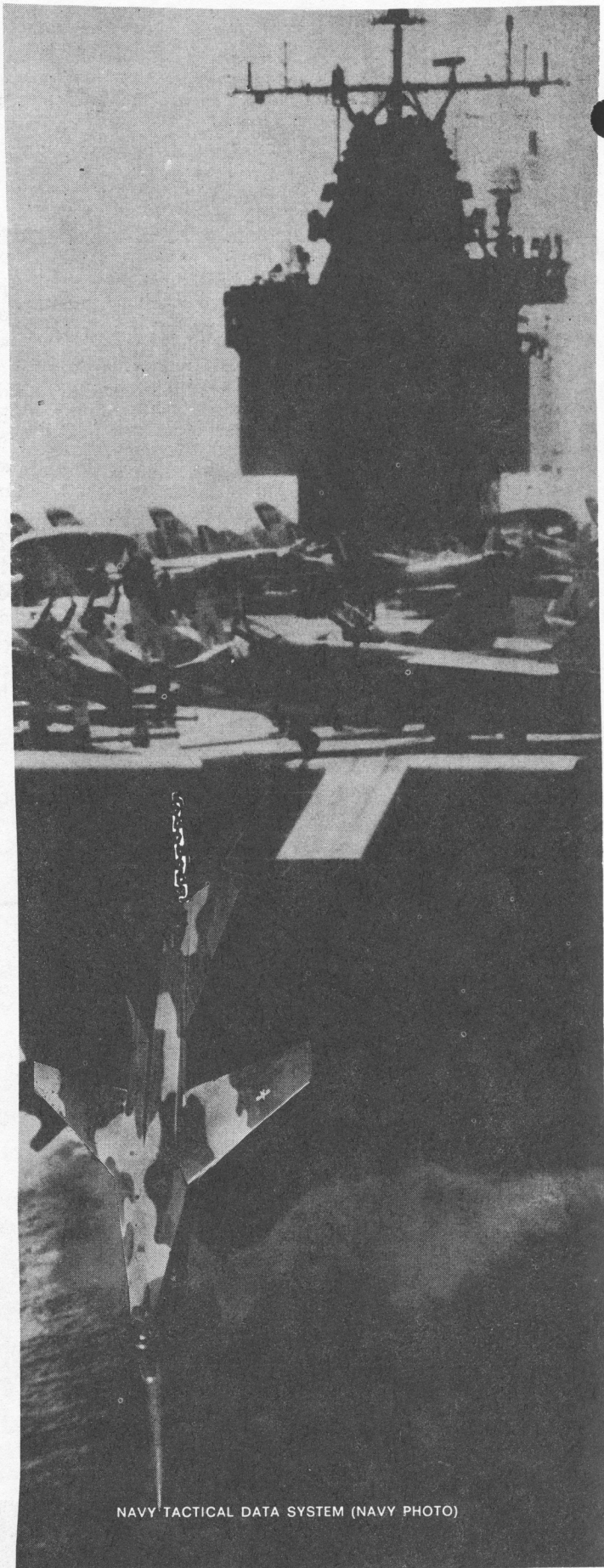

By the way, would the dude who requested 1000 sweatogs in Chicago please step forward--31 guys/squadron would like to speak to you!

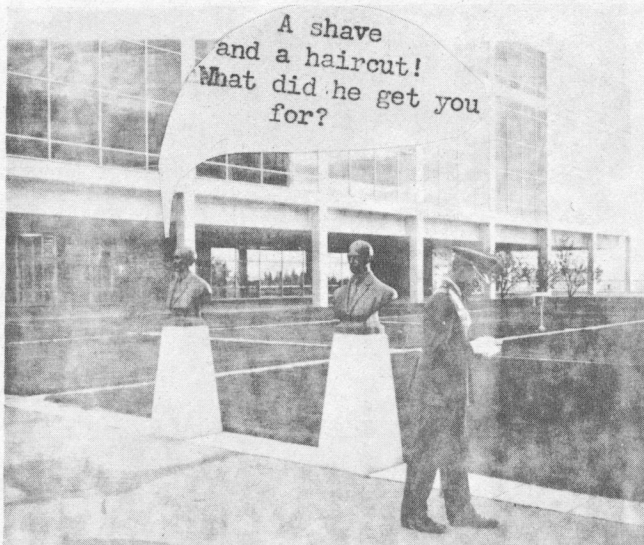
Sorry guys, but no water for the Wing at home football games! We tried!! But the surgeon said we don't get thirsty and the dining hall can't supply the water without further budgeting.
