A little personal advice from the DoDo staff:

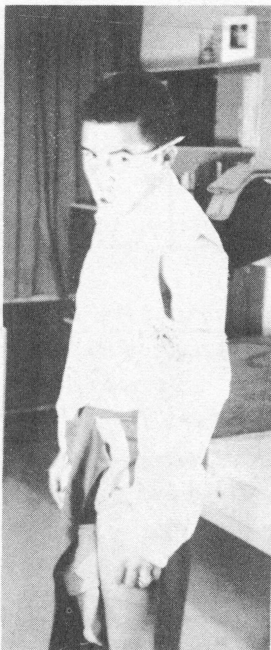

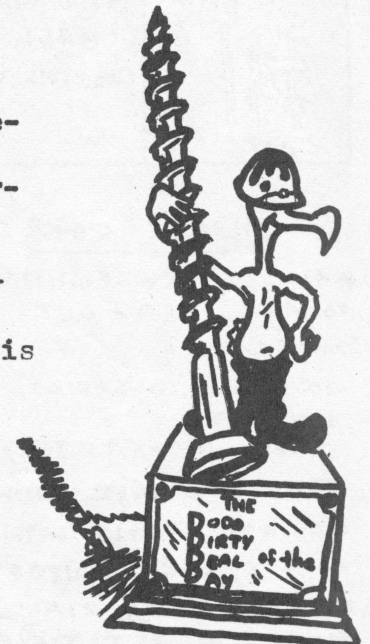
The Dodo Dirty Deal of the Day
