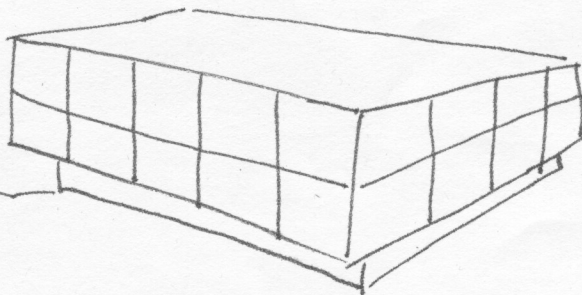
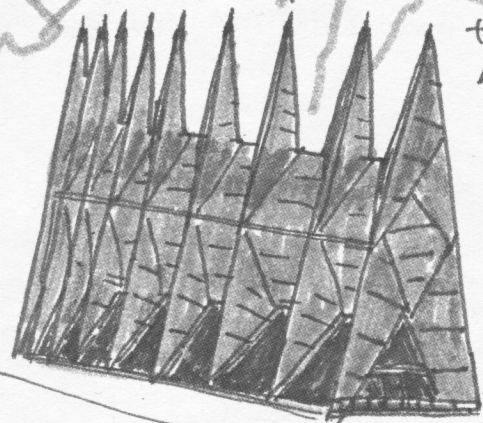


# Welcome... tourist, to the UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY!

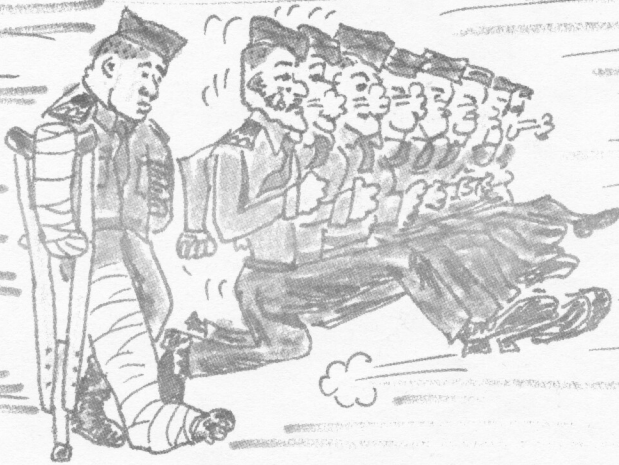

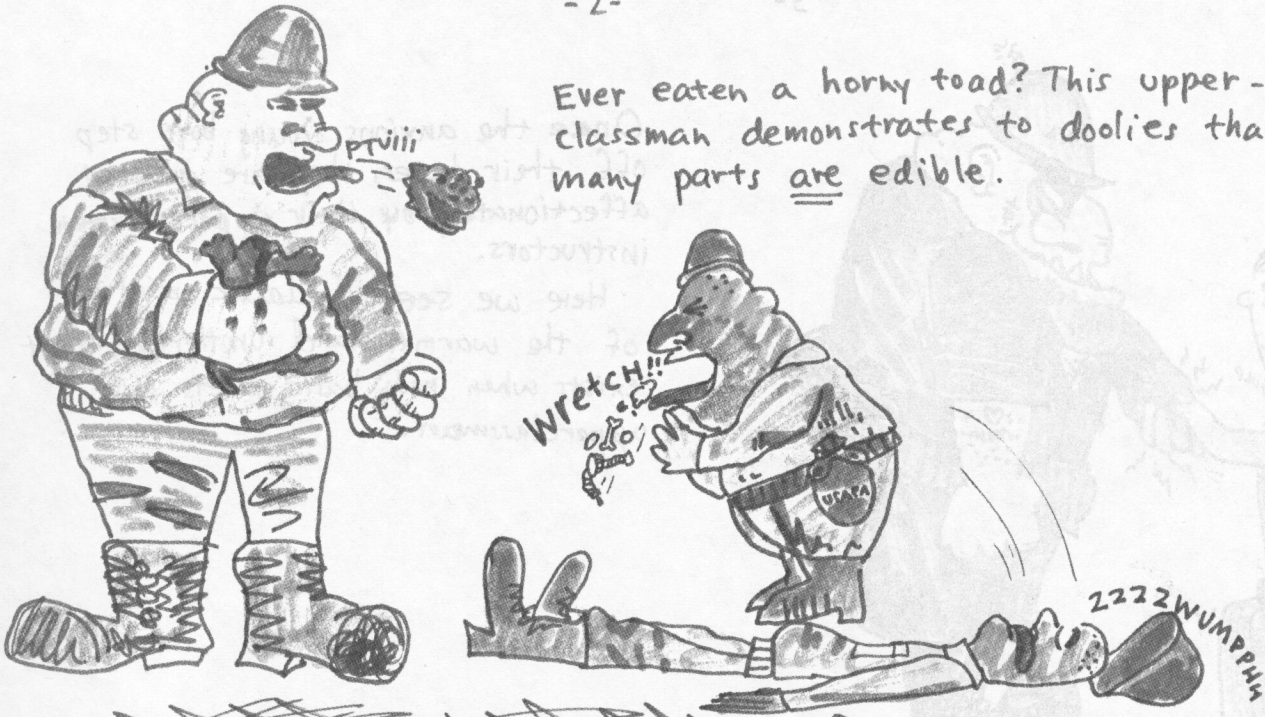
Here we see a 4th classman breathing. This is just one of the many privileges that the doolies receive after being accepted into the wing.

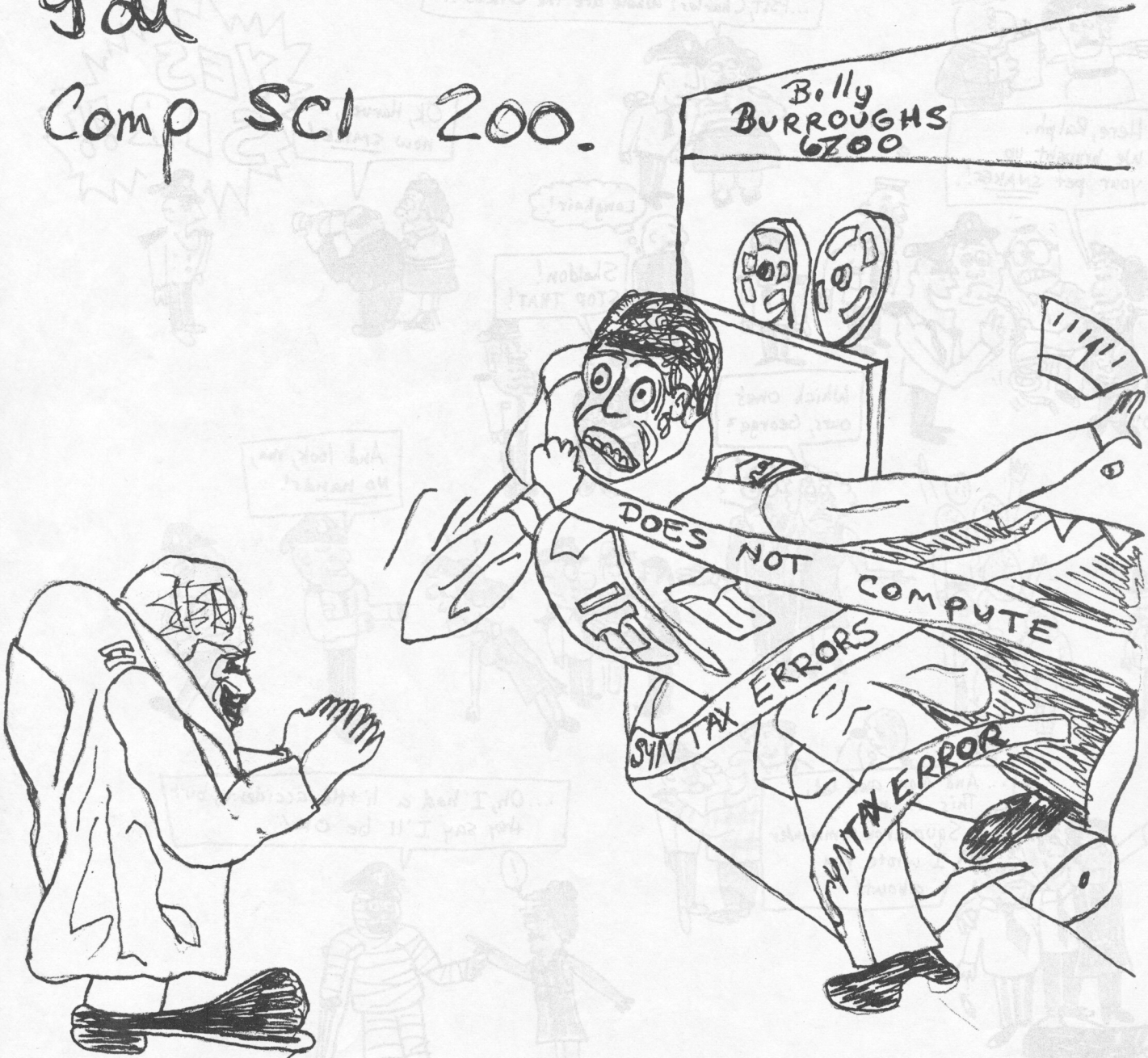


