The Cadet Chorale

The Cadet Chorale, composed of selected members from the Catholic and Protestant Cadet Choirs, is divided into two groups. The Fourth Class Chorale appears locally and spends time learning the foundation of the Chorale's repertoire while the Upper Class Chorale, made up from the first, second and third classes perform both locally and nationwide. Limited to one rehearsal per week, plus occasional special rehearsals, the Chorale attempts to change its repertoire from year to year while maintaining that foundation which has built the Chorale's reputation. One of the few cadet organizations which performs regularly outside the environs of the Academy, the Chorale has a mission of pride — to represent the Air Force Cadet Wing through music. In the three years that members of the class of 1975 have been a part of the Chorale, the public relations work of the group has allowed considerable travel and exposure. Among the events and locations visited by the Chorale in the past three years are the 1973 Presidential Inauguration in Washington, DC, the nationally televised Air Force-Notre Dame football game in November of 1973, and an extremely successful set of performances at Expo '74 in Spokane, Washington, in September of 1974.

Our director, Mr. James Roger Boyd, is completing his 18th year as the director of the Cadet Chorale. He also serves as the Protestant Choir Director and Organist. Mr. Boyd has been the Chorale's director since its creation in 1957. He has built the chorale into the organization it is today. Our associate director is Mr. Edmund L. Ladouceur, who also serves as the Catholic Choir Director and Organist. He is an expert at the keyboard, and is responsible for arranging most of the second half of this evening's program.

It is the hope of the Chorale members of the class of 1975 that this year has served to build on the reputation of the Chorale as a nationally known musical organization. We pass on the tradition of musical excellence to the class of 1976 and wish next year's Chorale continued success.
