CADET CLOTHING

This regulation prescribes clothing to be worn by cadets, lists authorized uniform combinations, and describes policy and procedures for procurement and maintenance of uniforms and clothing.

SECTION A - PRESCRIBED CLOTHING FOR WEAR BY CADETS

1. Authority to Prescribe or Substitute Authorized Clothing Combinations:

- a. Authorized uniform combinations listed in Section B are the only uniform combinations prescribed for wear by cadets. The Senior Officer of the Day (SOD) will determine daily wear of authorized uniform combinations in accordance with Command Post standing instructions.
- b. Uniforms prescribed for duty in this section will not be substituted for any other authorized type without prior approval of the Deputy Commandant of Cadets for the Cadet Wing.
- c. Cadets in charge of specific functions or activities will prescribe appropriate authorized uniform combinations if provisions for them are not contained in this regulation. In such instances, they will obtain prior approval from the office of the Deputy Commandant for the Cadet Wing.
- d. During off-duty periods, cadets may substitute an authorized uniform combination of a higher precedence for the Uniform of the Day. Clothing order of precedence is as follows: Parade Dress, Service Alpha, Service Bravo, Service Charlie, Service Delta, Utility Uniform.
- e. Civilians are not allowed to wear cadet uniforms. Cadets aiding and abetting such actions are subject to punishment under the Uniform Code of Military Justice for violation of Article 92 (Failure to obey a Lawful General Order or Regulation) or Article 134 (General Article).
- f. Cadets proceeding individually within the Cadet Area may wear any outer garment as prescribed in para 18 this regulation compatible with the Uniform of the Day.

2. Uniform Signal Lights. The uniform signal lights will be used to indicate the prescribed uniform. The signal lights are as follows:

3. Uniform of the Day (UOD). The Uniform of the Day is the uniform prescribed for wearing in the cadet area. The UOD is always Service Alpha unless otherwise directed.

a. Authorized uniform combinations that may be designated by the SOD, from the first Monday in October to the first Monday in May (winter period) are:

(1) From 1700 Sunday to Reveille Saturday.

- (a) Service Alpha
- (b) Service Bravo
- (c) Service Charlie
- (d) Service Delta

(2) From Reveille Saturday to 1700 Sundays and holidays:

- (a) Service Alpha
- (b) Service Bravo

b. Authorized uniform combinations that may be prescribed for wear by the SOD during the summer period are:
